1. Read John 2:4, what is your initial reaction to Jesus' response to Mary? Why? Does the fact that the word "Woman" is used as a title of respect change your reaction?
2. In the message, it was suggested that we can surmise from Jesus' response that He did not have to do what He did but He did it anyways. How can understanding this approach be meaningful to you?
3. Read these following passages in John

**16:25-32**                      **16:25-32**                      **17:1**  
We see the context of time/hour as it relates to Jesus. What do these verses teach us about Jesus' response in John 2:4 about His "hour has not yet come?"
4. Read Matthew 22:35-40; Matthew 28:18-20; Romans 12:1-2; II Corinthians 3:18; Galatians 5:24. In the message, it was suggested that this miracle points to the transforming power of Jesus in our lives. With these passages in view, in what ways does Jesus transform us? Can you think of other ways found in the Bible in which Jesus transforms certain areas in our lives?
5. In the Gospel of John, we read many statements that Jesus make that shows that satisfaction can only be found in Him. In what ways have you seen Jesus satisfy your spiritual hunger or thirst? What areas of your life do still find some satisfaction? How can Jesus fulfill that need if you turn it over to Him?
6. Mary asked the servants to do whatever Jesus says. What must we do to invite what Jesus wants to do in our lives?
