- 1, Rest
- 2. Rejoice

<u>3 Ways to Look at these Feasts</u>

- 1. Past Tense
- 2. Present Tense
- 3. Prophetic Tense

The Seven Feasts of Israel

I. Passover

- 1. Celebrate Israel's freedom from slavery.
- 2. Jesus Christ is our Passover Lamb.
- 3. We celebrate our own freedom from sin and God's judgement.

II. Feast of the Unleavened Bread

- 1. Due to the hastiness of the Israelite Exodus, there was no time to add leaven (yeast).
- 2. Jesus is the perfect sinless Bread of Life.
- 3. A reminder to us that we also remove the practice of sin from our lives.

III. Feast of Firstfruits

- 1. A time to thank and honor God for all He provided.
- 2. The Feast of Firstfruits were celebrated on the third day after Passover.
- 3. Jesus is the firstfruit of the resurrection.

VI. The Day of Atonement

- 1. A feast where the entire nation of Israel's sin was dealt with as a whole.
- 2. Jesus is our High Priest.
- 3. The Day of Atonement was also about God's Judgement.

IV. Feast of Weeks

- 1. Occurred 50 days after the Feast of the Firstfruits.
- 2. It was a celebration of thanksgiving for a bountiful harvest.
- 3. In the New Testament, it is known by another name Pentecost

V. Feast of Trumpets

- 1. It was in preparation for the Day of Atonement
- 2. <u>Numbers 10</u> presents three reasons that a trumpet sounds. One of those being a call to assembly.
- 3. The trumpet is often tied to the time when the church will assemble with Jesus.

VII. The Feast of Booths

- 1. Coincides with the final harvest of the year and remembers and celebrate how God not only took care of them but how His presence came down and lived with them.
- 2. It was a call to rest and to enjoy His presence.
- 3. Jesus was God tabernacling with His people (God with us).
- 4. The Holy Spirit is God tabernacling in us.
- 5. There is coming a time when God will ultimately tabernacle with us, without the presence of sin.

Takeaways from Leviticus

- 1. It is about God's desire to dwell with His people.
- 2. It shows that obedience brings blessings. (Read Lev. 26)
- 3. God is holy and as His redeemed people, we are holy.
- 4. We do holy things, not to be holy but because we are holy.
- 5. Viewed with the Gospel lens, the book helps to show the unfolding of God's plan.
