The Principle of Leviticus Today

Because The Holy God redeemed us, we reflect His holiness daily by living the way that God has declared us to live.

Why obedience is still important?

- Obedience to God proves our love for Him
- Demonstrates our faithfulness to Him
- Glorifies Him in the world
- Opens avenues of blessing for us

The Law of Liberty

What is the Law of Liberty?

- **It released us from condemnation (Romans 5:1, 8:1)**
- **It gives us the ability to please God as put off the works of the flesh (Galatians 5, Colossians 3:1-9)**
- **It is the ability to live a life of love (Colossians 3:12-17)**
- **It is walking in the Spirit (Galatians 5, Ephesians 5:17-21)**

Defining the Law of Liberty

The law of liberty is a reflection of His character—the ultimate standard of and shapes the right relationships between the Creator and man, also the relationships between man to man. Both God and the law are summed up in the word “love” (1 John 4:8; Romans 13:10).
