Takeaways

- 1. We were in a position just like the lepers. Separated from A HOLY GOD, THE SOVEREIGN KING OF THE UNIVERSE WHO CREATED US and is OUR SOURCE OF LIFE but thankfully through Jesus, our relationship with God has been restored and we have been made whole.
- 2. It is not enough to recognize Jesus as the MASTER over sin, disease, shame, and guilt. We must also acknowledge HIM as MASTER over our lives.
- 3. No cry to Jesus goes to Him in vain. He hears us. He remembers us. He sees us.
- 4. It is possible to get so caught up with following religion and traditionalism that you will miss Jesus.
- 5. The Christian life is a life of thanks living and when we fully acknowledge the gravity and the consequences of our sin, it will allow us to see the depth and the breadth and the height of God's love and grace and serve as the motivation in how we live.
