If nursery (ages 0-5) would be a blessing to you during Worship, please reach out to Becky@sjpres.org to arrange care for future



The Practice of Lectio Divina

Hebrews 4:12 "For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart."

Based on the above passage, practicing Lectio Divina (divine reading) is one of putting yourself in submission to God's Word and of listening to the Spirit speak as you read.

It is often practiced as a solo reading but today we will practice it in our corporate worship. It is best done in several steps.

Pray for the Holy Spirit to speak to you. This sets you in a posture of submission. We will read the passage three times. For the first reading we will listen for the Spirit to speak through words phrases that stand out. (You might write them down)

During the second reading, listen again for words and phrases but also for meaning. Is there an idea/thought that comes to you from the words the Spirit brings to mind?

During the third reading, does God confirm what you've heard before or bring up something new? After this reading we will turn what God has spoken to you into a prayer.

14 But the Pharisees went out and plotted how they might kill lesus.

15 Aware of this, Jesus withdrew from that place. A large crowd followed him, and he healed all who were ill. 16 He warned them not to tell others about him. 17 This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah:

I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations.

19 He will not quarrel or cry out;

no one will hear his voice in the streets.

20 A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he has brought justice through to victory. **21** In his name the nations will put their hope."
