Ekklesia (part 4): The Movement Moves & the Message

In a country where you have the freedom to worship God and the opportunity to rally around this life-changing message, why doesn't everyone take advantage of it?

The church is a movement. It's a movement around a very simple gospel that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, who died on the cross and he rose from the dead.

Acts 5:41-42

Acts 8:1-3

At the end of three years of unchecked persecution of the church, something incredible happened that changed everything for Paul. Plus it changed everything for the spread of the Ekklessia!

Acts 9:1-2

Acts 9:3-6

Acts 9:10-16

Acts 9:19b-21

After twelve to fourteen years of preparation, he launched out on what we call "Paul's Missionary Journeys."

During those ten to twelve years, he stopped in each of these cities. Paul actually planted little *ekklesias*, little churches, little gatherings.

And today people name their dogs, Nero, and their sons, Paul!

Unexplainable and bad things happen to people who are extraordinarily faithful and God is not rocked by it!

Throughout the book of Acts we don't find Christians huddled together, afraid that God has lost control, afraid that maybe God doesn't love them anymore, etc...

God raised up Paul to help those of us who don't have an Old Testament background, who weren't looking for a Messiah, for the people in his day that weren't looking for a Messiah, in order to understand what is <u>the essence of the gospel</u>.

I Corinthians 15:1-8

- 1) Christ died for our sin
- 2) He was buried
- 3) He was raised
- 4) He appeared
