Different perspectives lead to different conclusions about the same issue.

I need to understand that from where I stand that number will never be a 9. I need to understand that from where she stands that number will never be a 6. I need to accept that, from our differing perspectives, we are both right. Am I willing? If I am not, then I am the one who is wrong!

Story of Romans 14 & 15...

1st Century Christian Conflict—

- Surface: To eat or not to eat food offered to idols?
- Reality: To accept or not accept my brother/sister with a different perspective?

21st Century Christian Conflict—

- To wear or not wear a face mask?
- Racism is/is not systemic in America.
- Law enforcement in America is/is not intrinsically racist.
- To be and vote liberal or conservative?
- Not, "What's wrong with you?" but, "What happened—what is your experience?"
 - Principle #1: We accept; we do not judge in matters of opinion. Romans 14:1, 13; 15:7

Big Idea:

We will never always agree. (We have different perspectives.) But we can always love and accept each other. (Christ has accepted us!)

Big Challenge:

Express love and acceptance to someone with whom you fundamentally disagree.
