# FROM THE ELDERS



Dear BCC family,

So, the Holy Spirit has compelled us to pursue a location for the church and community, in the center of Brighton; a space where we continuously extend His love and salvation to those who do not know Him; a place where Heaven meets Earth.

He will oppose us with false accusations that question the integrity and motives of the elders. the flame and follow Him into the good and pleasing future He has prepared. The elders are committed to being obedient to His command and commission to the Church and we pray that you will join us in a full pursuit of glorifying Jesus Christ through our lives, fellowship, and community.

We believe that this year is a pivotal one for our church family. Please join us in prayer for the following needs:

- That we would have a zeal for prayer, the Word, worship, the body of Christ and the lost.
- That the Lord will bring physical, relational, emotional, and spiritual healing to those in the church who need it.
- Deliverance from bondage of sin (addictions, bitterness, complacency, pride, self, etc...) and affliction of the enemy.
- For a greater love for others, evident by our commitment to gather together, make disciples, and reach the lost. We are praying for 50 salvations this year! It will only be possible through willing hearts.
- For Unity in the body.
- Pray for the church. That we catch the vision, and become zealous participants in where God is leading.
- Pray for our elders. That they would faithfully shepherd with wisdom, strength, and joy that comes from the Lord. Protection from spiritual attacks of the enemy. God's blessing over them and their families.
- That the Lord would clearly direct us and provide us with the right location to purchase, giving us favor with both the seller and the city.
- The Lord's guidance in leveraging our current properties (44 acres on Bauer and 10 acres on Buno) to acquire the downtown property, debt free. Our goal is that our downtown location will serve as a place of sustainable ministry to our community in addition to our location for Sunday worship gatherings

- Faithful giving and joyful generosity to support the mission and vision of the church through our tithes and offerings. Greater understanding, faith, and stewardship of how we can honor Christ and advance His Kingdom through the resources He has already given us.
- That through it all, Jesus would be glorified!

Please pray with us, concerning these needs and know that the elders welcome your feedback, as we move forward together. We know there are real challenges ahead, and the task will not be easy. God seldom gives us easy things that we can accomplish in our own strength. We also know that we do not labor in vain when we are doing the work that Lord has called us to. Jesus is present and calls us out, saying, "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior."

While the road ahead will likely be challenging at times, we walk confidently knowing there is true joy in the journey. Our encouragement to you is found in this passage from **Philippians 2:2-5**:



# NEXT GENERATION

The next generation ministries at Brighton Christian Church saw a year of transition, perseverance and new endeavors as we relied on God for His leading. Within the first quarter of the year, all of the major leaders and teachers serving kids and teens gathered for a time of fellowship, brainstorming and communication with one another—the first meeting of this kind in years. While we all serve in various roles and capacities, it's vital to remember we're all laboring in unity toward the same objective: discipling the next generation of servants, leaders and lovers of Jesus. It's these faithful leaders, teacher and volunteers that I'm grateful to God for. A special thank you to Dot Gregory, Paula Styles, Paul Jones and Cathy Jones for your faithful oversight in your specific ministries. And, a heartfelt appreciation is owed to the many teachers, helpers, commanders, caretakers and leaders who serve week in and week out—thank you.

Beginning a new year causes me to reflect on the twists and turns of 2018, and, to recalibrate a gospel centered, Bible saturated, Spirit led vision for 2019. Being a year of transition means that 2018 saw additions and changes to leadership, as well as new ministries and new curriculums. Some of the most significant transitions were the GEMS program morphing into our current Sparkle ministry on Wednesdays; two of our Sunday morning ministries installing a 3—year long curriculum called Gospel Project, as well as renaming all of our Sunday morning classrooms. Royal Rangers sustained a solid leadership team who continues to teach boys how to become Christ-like young men. Regarding youth group, I had the privilege of beginning the school year with four new additions to the leadership team. Overall, the body of Christ has stepped up into her calling to make disciples—specifically of the next generation.

As 2019 continues to unfold, we don't plan on retreating in any way or aiming for the status quo. All eight Next Generation ministries—Nursery, Barnyard Buddies, Jungle Jumpers, Kingdom Kids, Savior Seekers, Sparkle, Royal Rangers and Ignite Youth Group will continue to move forward in stride. My main goal as the Next Generation Pastor, is to develop the teams of these ministries into sustainable, Gospel-centered, discipleship focused, healthy leadership teams. In Ephesians 4, the Apostle Paul says that Jesus has given the church pastors and teachers: "to prepare

God's people for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up" (**Eph. 4:12**). Therefore, my job is not to do it all, but to equip God's people for building up the body of Christ. As this equipping and building up happens, I think we'll begin to see the next part of what Paul writes: "unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God" and becoming "mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ" (**Eph. 4:13**).

Though God has provided a large number of faithful helpers, teachers and volunteers, the reality is that we're still in need of more help—particularly with our two sets of older kids on Sunday morning: Kingdom Kids and Savior Seekers. Keeping ministries sustainable means we don't overwork volunteers, which means we need a large enough team to rotate through. If you're able to devote one Sunday a month to helping us bolster these ministries—please talk with me. I'd love to figure out how to best plug you in.

My prayer for all of us, whether we're a volunteer or not, is that we would not waste 2019 according to Christ's word. I pray that we would live like the first century church of Acts, actually expecting our lord's return and fulfilling His commission until the day we see Him face-to-face. May God himself—not any of these gifts—be our greatest treasure, reward and satisfaction. The world is thirsty—let's show them how Jesus is the only satisfaction for the human soul.

# KINGDOM KIDS

## Kindergarten—Grade 3

Our ministry to BCC's younger group of elementary schoolers on Sundays saw a year of new developments in 2018. Along with the rest of Sunday morning ministries, "Kingdom Kids" was the result of a name change in order to not be so plain vanilla. Formerly known as "Kid's Church," Kingdom Kids now ministers to children in kindergarten through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Beginning this past school year, the 4<sup>th</sup> graders moved from Kingdom Kids to the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders in Savior Seekers—a better fit for both them and the teachers.

Alongside Savior Seekers, this ministry also began a brand new curriculum by LifeWay called, "The Gospel Project." We started this teaching material this past September and will utilize it for discipling the next generation for the next two-and-a-half years. The Gospel Project spends three years journeying kids through the entire Bible, with a special focus on learning and living the gospel. Through well created Bible story videos, engaging worship songs and real life Q & A videos, teachers help kids see how all of the Bible contributes to the gospel, and how live it out based on their stage of life. This has been a great transition to Kingdom Kids and we look forward to how God will continue using it.

This important ministry was blessed by God to gain a few new volunteers who serve as both teachers and helpers. A special thank you to all of you who dedicate one Sunday every month to investing in the spiritual formation of these precious little ones—I deeply appreciate you. Though grateful for who we gained, Kingdom Kids is still in need of a couple more teachers and helpers. Consider how God may use one Sunday of your month to pour into His flock. Please talk with me and I'd be delighted to figure out how to plug you in.

My prayer for Kingdom Kids is that they would truly encounter the living God through His living Word, and would not leave "Sunday school" unchanged. I pray we as teachers and helpers would actively rely on the Spirit for loving, teaching and modeling the character of Christ to these little watchers. May God be glorified in the highest!

# SAVIOR SEEKERS

Grades 4—6

Savior Seekers is the new name for the former ministry, “Club 56.” This change came about last year as the decision was made to better balance the number of elementary kids between two Sunday ministries. The fourth graders were originally a part of Kid’s Church (now called “Kingdom Kids”) but have now merged with the 5th and 6th graders—hence a new name. This shift has been beneficial for the teachers, helpers and kids of both Savior Seekers and Kingdom Kids.

One of the most exciting and ministry-changing developments was the installation of a new curriculum called, “The Gospel Project” beginning September of 2018. This three year-long, well designed teaching material walks kids through the entire Bible with a special focus on learning how all parts of scripture contribute to the gospel—the core of our faith and practice. Far from merely imparting information, this curriculum is meant to help teachers form the minds, hearts and lives of their children based on their stage of life.

This past year, a few volunteers joined the team as either a teacher or helper. These faithful servants dedicate one Sunday every month to pouring into BCC’s 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> graders. I am grateful for their heart of servanthood and love; they are a blessing to minister with. Even though God has brought these teachers and helpers to the team, we’re still in need of two more teachers and some extra helpers. Please consider what God would have you do with one Sunday a month.

Lord willing, 2019 will be another year of striving toward saying to the Savior Seekers what Paul said to the Corinthians: “Follow me as I follow Christ.” We pray God would use our efforts to accomplish His purposes. *Your kingdom come, Lord!*

# ROYAL RANGERS

## Pre-K—Grade 8

Many of you know OF our Rangers program, but maybe not ABOUT it. In a nutshell, it is a Christ-centered Next Generation mentoring program for boys. Just one of the many Next Generation ministries we provide at Brighton Christian Church.

We meet at BCC on Wednesday nights throughout the school year to participate in or host a number of extracurricular events; many designed for dads and boys to participate in together; some for the entire Rangers family. The formal program is open to boys aging from four years old up through the eighth grade, with our Jr. Commander Program extending into high-school.

The national Royal Rangers mission statement is “Reaching, teaching, and keeping boys for Christ.” We do this through a number of means that you can find in our New Parent Letter. At Outpost 262 we add to that our own mission statement and it is based on Matthew 22: “Our mission is to teach the next generation of young men how to love God with all of their heart, with all of their soul, with all of their mind, and with all of their strength; second only to that, how to love each other; and how to build relationships that will last a lifetime and beyond.” Year over year we continue to build out the program around these mission statements where it makes sense and where it brings glory to God.

In the fall 2016 we instituted a Leadership Academy for 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade boys that we now conduct twice a year in the spring and in the fall. Each is a different 3-weekend program that builds on the previous, and consists of six hours of classroom teaching and situational exercises, plus 3 to 4 hours of community service over the course of three weekends.

After a good deal of consideration, we have instituted a Junior Commander program designed to challenge students in helping teach and lead the younger groups with oversight at our Wednesday night club, and also to enter into a one-on-one, life-on-life mentoring relationship with one of the adult commanders.

I sincerely believe that God's hand is on this ministry and if we are faithful, we will see it continue to grow.

# SPARKLE

## Pre-K—Grade 5

The vision of Sparkle is to bring girls into a living, dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ...to equip them and motivate them so that they can passionately live out their faith. God's plan is always an adventure and we look forward to all He has in store for us.

In Sparkle, girls learn to worship through creative movement during the opening. They are led in a direct object lesson/devotion that is centered on the scripture of the lesson for the day. Then we take up an offering, pray, celebrate any current birthdays and watch an object lesson video which they then discuss in their designated classes. Their classes also include the main Bible lesson and craft. Girls learn to serve Jesus by serving each other and also by serving our community. The girls this year will be earning "sparkles" for various verses memorized, books of the Bible memorized, being helpful, attendance, etc. Then they will be able to spend their "sparkles" at the Sparkle Store which will be developed in the near future.

The vision for this year is to continue to disciple young girls into the Kingdom. Although we are small in number, we always pray that God will grow us as He sees fit. Some of our activities for this year include: a hayride; Operation Christmas Child; a Christmas Party; Partnering with House of Providence (TBD); Easter outreach (TBD); Celebration night in May.

At this time we will work with the budgeted amount of \$1,550.00. New Sparkle shirts were purchased at the beginning of the year, with the new DIG IN online portal.

We counselors and the director of Sparkle consider it pure joy to serve our great King Jesus and our family at BCC.

It's also our ministry as leaders to not only serve students but parents as well. We recognize the God-appointed authority of parents in their child's life, so we value partnership between home and church. We hope to keep moving forward in unity with the parents of Ignite students as 2019 unfolds. Thank you for the blessing of partnering with you in the discipling of your family.

This past year we dove into topics of all kinds in order to "be transformed, by the renewing of our minds." We spent four weeks unpacking a teaching series called "God and Sexuality" and learned about ways in which God has designed us and called us to live. We uncovered some of the riches of Colossians and the book of James. One of our longest series was based on a book by Timothy Keller called, *Counterfeit Gods* and it was all about purging our heart of idols by making God Himself our satisfaction. Several other series were taught and intended to help students grow as disciples of Jesus.






