MINISTRY REPORTS



Being salt and light in this world



NEXT GENERATION

This January marks the completion of my fourth year serving our Lord as Youth and children's Pastor at Brighton Christian Church. What a privilege it's been to serve Him and His church in this way. I only have greater expectation of how God will use 2020 in my life and the life of BCC as we move forward.

Our church's Next Generation ministry consists of seven separate ministries, serving about sixty-five minors from newborns to graduating seniors, with roughly fifty-five volunteer leaders who serve on a weekly and monthly basis throughout the year. Over the course of 2019, these ministries saw good fruit, steady commitment and important changes. The biggest leadership transition took place in the preschool ministry as Dot Gregory stepped down and Emily Mecham stepped up as the new preschool coordinator. On behalf of BCC and the lives she touched, I would like to say thank you to Dot Gregory for the many years she gave to the upbuilding of God's kingdom. She leaves behind a faithful legacy that I'm confident Emily will perpetuate.

Concerning Wednesday evening ministry, Paul Jones continues to lead and oversee the discipleship of boys and young men, and Paula Styles continues to do the same for the girls and young women. These leaders and their ministry-partners set excellent examples of lives devoted to Christ and his Kingdom. Myself and my youth group leaders plan to wholeheartedly proceed in outreach to the lost and in the spiritual development of those following Christ.

More specific plans for 2020 revolve around the creation of procedures, policies, safety measures and accountability for all things Next Gen. Though we are a small family church, we nonetheless need structures in place that foster better health for both kids and volunteers. Things like developing a requirements handbook for the onboarding process of new volunteers; or utilizing department-wide training for working with minors; or establishing better safety precautions for each ministry, are all examples of items in the agenda for 2020. Such structures to be put in place are only intended to cultivate the good things that happen within them, namely, the work of Christ in the lives of this upcoming generation.

How can you, as the church body, serve this department and our efforts in the coming 12 months? One word: prayer. Don't underestimate the prerogative God has graciously allotted to you as an intercessor. He intends for His will to become your will,

So He might make real effects in the world and in our church through your prayers of intercession. Pray that all us leaders would stand in awe of the glory of God before we pour out ourselves into others; pray that Christ would be the greatest love and all-surpassing treasure in our hearts and in the hearts of our little flocks; pray that god's Word may spread among their non-believing friends, neighbors and family and that he may "add to [our] number daily those who are being saved" (Acts 2:47). Besides the importance of prayer as a core way to serve us, involvement is the other core way. I know that many of you are already involved to a greater or lesser degree, but if you're not, know that we could always use your partnership. The ideal is to spread the burden and calling among lots of shoulders so that the labor is most effectively done from a refreshed heart.

As 2020 continues to unfold, and as the spiritual battle continues to rage, let us take heart and behold the one who sustains "all things by his powerful word" (Heb. 1:3) and the one who has been given supreme "authority in heaven and on earth" (Matt. 28:18). Let us behold Him who holds the keys of death and hades (Rev. 18) and promises that the gates of hell will fail in overcoming his Bride (Matt. 16:18). Our hope in 2020 is that this all-glorious, triune God will carry out His good, pleasing and perfect will among us. May the next generation become ever-captivated in ever-satisfied by the reality of this radiantly magnificent God, and live for Him, with Him, and in Him, forever!

KINGDOM KIDS

Kindergarten—Grade 3

Kingdom Kids is BCC's Sunday morning ministry to boys and girls in Kindergarten through third grade that meets almost every Sunday throughout the year. The spiritual nourishment this classroom feeds on each week is from a biblically sound curriculum by LifeWay Christian Resources called, "The Gospel Project."

We kicked off this curriculum September of 2018 and as of this January, we'll be starting volume six of twelve, marking the halfway point. This curriculum is designed to do two things well: 1) teach kids each (major) story of scripture as it should be understood in its own context, and, 2) connect that story to the larger narrative of the Bible to show the big picture, namely, the character of God and the meaning of the gospel. It also does a great job helping kids realize where they fit into the story and how God calls them to live, believe and relate.

A ministry like Kingdom Kids is impossible without teachers. For about half of this past year, the classroom sustained a monthly rotation of teachers but since then we've been in need of two to three more. As the leader of this ministry, I invite you to consider coming on board and investing in the Next Generation once a month for about an hour during service. May God show you the value of such investment and make a way for you to jump in. If you decide to take this step, my email address is below and is a good way to get ahold of me.

As 2020 rolls on, my eyes are set on bolstering this ministry to be as strong, God-honoring, Bible-saturated and child-edifying as it can be. Kids grow up all too quickly so it's imperative to "redeem the time" ([Eph. 5:16](#)) and inundate their minds and hearts with the things of God. My prayer is that each child would know Christ for themselves and live for Him, for His sake. I also desire to foster more at-home connection from Kingdom Kids on Sunday morning: discussion with parents, scripture memory, bringing a weekly offering, etc. While there are many things to celebrate from the past year, I seek to build on these things and develop a gospel-centered ministry for these precious little ones. May God be glorified!

SAVIOR SEEKERS

Grades 4—6

Savior Seekers ministry serves the largest number of children on Sunday morning and has been sustaining a healthy rotation of 4 monthly teachers and helpers for the past year. The consistency and faithfulness of the teaching and helping team helped lay a solid foundation of biblical teaching and genuine care. It's our earnest desire to only continue this tradition into 2020.

As of this January, Savior Seekers will be halfway through the curriculum that launched September of 2018, called, "The Gospel Project" - which is a three year long journey through the Bible, from cover to cover. One standout feature of this curriculum is its effort to treat every story of scripture like a piece of a jigsaw puzzle, in order to display the big picture of the puzzle, namely: who God is, what the gospel is, and how life should change as a result. This January will mark the beginning of volume six of twelve. We look forward to journeying from the remainder of the Old Testament, into the New.

While the plan to continue the curriculum journey will remain in 2020, there are a few goals on the horizon that I envision us striving toward. Currently, one of our teachers is in the process of involving the kids in the development of classroom rules—a way to get kids to own the rules and show them that their input matters. We plan to finalize these rules as a leadership team and creatively display them in the classroom. Also on the horizon is developing ways for at-home involvement e.g. scripture memory, discussion with parents, bringing an offering, etc.

While I'm delighted to acknowledge the foundations laid thus far, I'm also desiring to advance this ministry into an even more healthy, God-exalting, children-edifying, Bible centered ministry. May Christ be magnified in 2020!

ROYAL RANGERS

Pre-K—Grade 8

Royal Rangers is a Christ-centered Next Generation mentoring program for boys. Just one of the many Next Generation ministries we provide at Brighton Christian Church. We meet at BCC on Wednesday nights throughout the school year to participate in or host a number of extracurricular events; many designed for dads and boys to participate in together; some for the entire Rangers family. The formal program is open to boys aging from four years old up through the eighth grade.

The national Royal Rangers mission statement is “Reaching, teaching, and keeping boys for Christ.” We do this through a number of means that you can find in our New Parent Letter. At Outpost 262 we add to that our own mission statement and it is based on Matthew 22: “Our mission is to teach the next generation of young men how to love God with all of their heart, with all of their soul, with all of their mind, and with all of their strength; second only to that, how to love each other; and how to build relationships that will last a lifetime and beyond.” Year over year we continue to build out the program around these mission statements; where it makes sense and where it brings glory to God.

Starting in fall of 2016 we instituted a Leadership Academy for 3rd—8th grade boys that we now conduct twice a year in the spring and in the fall. Each is a different 3-weekend program that builds on the previous, and consists of six hours of classroom teaching and situational exercises, plus 3 to 4 hours of community service over the course of three weekends. It is the vision and goal of Outpost 262 to provide a safe, inviting, and yet challenging environment for the boys to learn and stretch themselves.

We measure the success of our program not based on how many merits the boys earn, but based on our ability to teach them two things: 1) to love God with all their heart, 2) to love each other.

In addition to our regular weekly meetings, we also host or participate in several Outpost or Regional events throughout the year: Outpost Fall Camp Out, Avalanche Michigan Regional Father son mid-winter camp out, Outpost Pinewood Derby, Regional Pinewood Derby, Spring and Fall Leadership Academy, Various Community Service Projects, Outpost Spring Kayak Trip.

SPARKLE

Pre-K—Grade 5

The vision of Sparkle is to bring girls into a living, dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ...to equip them and motivate them so that they can passionately live out their faith. God's plan is always an adventure and we look forward to all He has in store for us.

In Sparkle, girls learn to worship through creative movement during the opening. They are led in a direct object lesson/devotion that is centered on the scripture of the lesson for the day. Then we take up an offering, pray, celebrate any current birthdays and watch an object lesson video which they then discuss in their designated classes. Their classes also include the main Bible lesson and craft. Girls learn to serve Jesus by serving each other and also by serving our community. The girls this year will be earning "sparkles" for various verses memorized, books of the Bible memorized, being helpful, attendance, etc. Then they will be able to spend their "sparkles" at the Sparkle Store which will be developed in the near future.

The vision for this year is to continue to disciple young girls into the Kingdom. Although we are small in number, we always pray that God will grow us as He sees fit. Some of our activities for this year include: a hayride; Operation Christmas Child; a Christmas Party; Partnering with House of Providence (TBD); Easter outreach (TBD); Celebration night in May.

At this time we will work with the budgeted amount of \$1,550.00. New Sparkle shirts were purchased at the beginning of the year, with the new DIG IN online portal.

We counselors and the director of Sparkle consider it pure joy to serve our great King Jesus and our family at BCC!

These lessons were a kind of maturity milestone that us leaders love to see because it's what we pray and labor for God to do.

Moving into the new year marks the turning of a new leaf in some ways. The past four years on Wednesday evenings our format has been evolving to better suit spiritual development, and 2020 will see to continue this tradition. This year, myself and the leaders plan to launch a trial period of allotting more quality time to small group interaction and less time to activities in the large group setting. The goal is to more specifically minister to each heart and mind based on where it is along the spiritual journey. This means that each small group will use a different, biblically solid, resource to address the age/gender-specific needs of each individual throughout the small groups. Such a format also seeks to cultivate closer student-to-student relationships, and leader-to-student relationships—all for the purpose of growing in Christ together.

My heart in 2020 will reflect my heart over the past four years: that each student to walk through Ignite Youth Ministry would 1) know Christ as Savior, and 2) grow into His likeness. I am hopeful for what our strong and gracious God will do in the lives of these important teens this year and beyond. To Him be all glory and honor and praise forever!

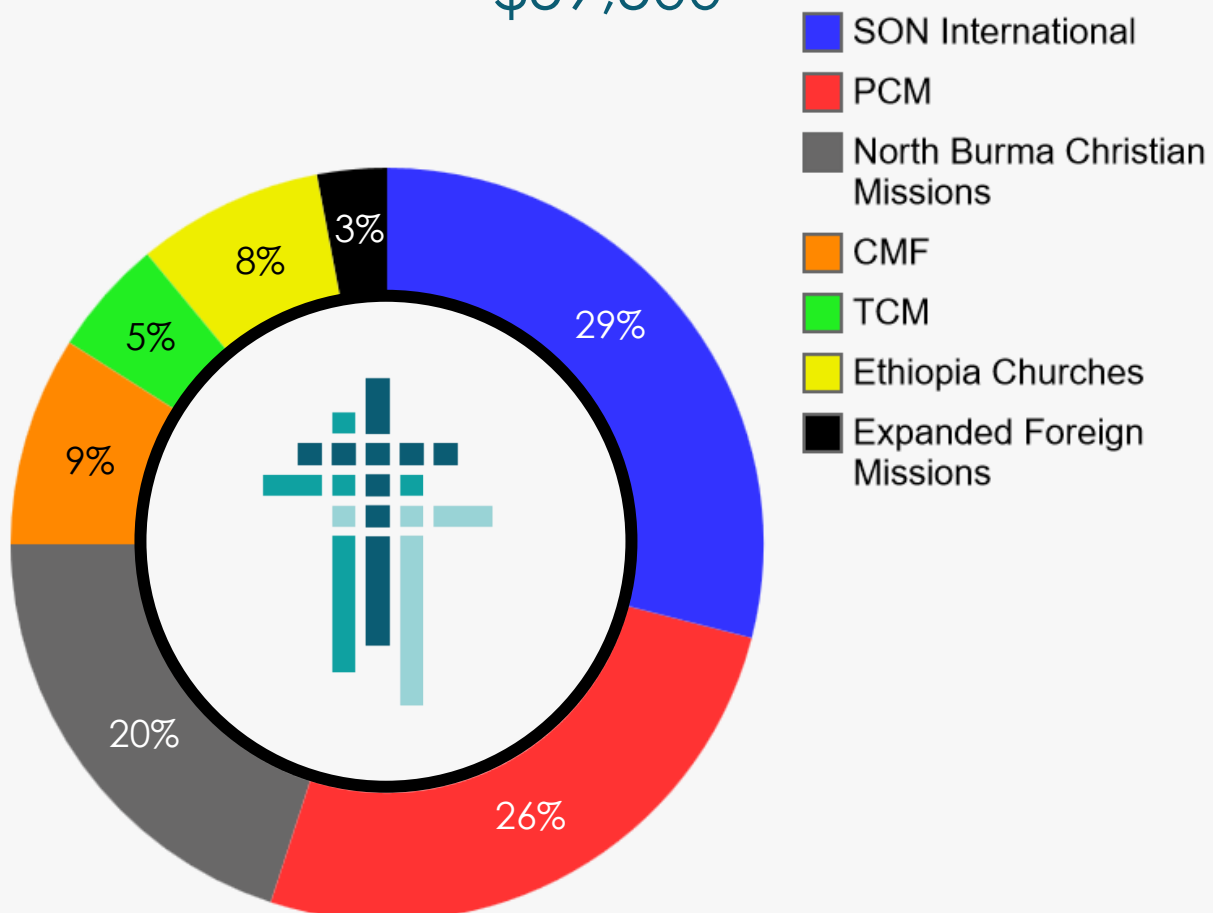

Downtown Vision

Brighton Christian church will have a continual presence in the center of our community. As the body of Christ we will meet here for intentional disciple making, fellowship, and service to those in our community for the glory of God.

A few features of the downtown vision are:

BCC Offices: Carrying out the daily business of the church downtown will increase our interaction and awareness of our community. Knowing the pulse of our community will increase our ministry opportunities and effectiveness in leading people to Jesus.



- Staff offices
- Ministry team meetings: elders, missions, finance, Next Gen., etc...
- Pastoral counseling

Common Space: This space is strategically located in the front of the facility to invite our community into a common space. This warm and inviting space is a place where friends can gather around a cup of coffee or a quiet spot to get some work done away from the office. The key to this space is spontaneous engagement and to raise awareness of what we offer the community.



- Tea and coffee bar where drinks and snacks can be purchased
- Full-kitchen
- Restrooms/Community library and books for purchase
- Free Wi-Fi
- A small conference room that can be reserved for private use
- Monitors highlighting BCC events, classes, service opportunities, etc...

Large Gathering Room: Just beyond the common space you can enter through a set of rustic barn doors into a large meeting room. This space is used for our BCC family for an array of Christ-centered ministry gatherings and events (some promoted to the community) which take place throughout the week.



- Sunday night **Berean** classes (Biblical & theological education)
- Monday Night **Prayer Gathering**
- Wednesday night **high-school youth** gathering (word, worship, & fellowship)
- Thursday night **Family Life** classes. Topics on marriage, parenting, stewardship/finances, conflict, addiction, sexuality, etc...
- Friday night **young adults** gathering & open mic nights
- **Special BCC gatherings:** Titus 2 men's events (i.e. breakfast, conference, etc...), Titus 2 women's events (tea, conferences, etc...), Daddy-Daughter events, Royal Rangers award banquet, teacher appreciation lunch, Women's Christmas party, Christian comedian, chili cook-off, life groups, etc...
- **Other:** Monthly Love Inc. monthly partners meeting, PCM annual board meeting, local ministers fellowship, swing dance group, etc...
- Tuesday evening disciple making focus: Spiritual disciplines, baptism, new members class, what is a Christian, etc...

Storefront provides access to Main Street events such as: Farmers Market, Independence Day parade, Brighton homecoming parade, car shows, art festival, summer concert series, BBQ jazz fest, fall festival, holiday glow, and more!

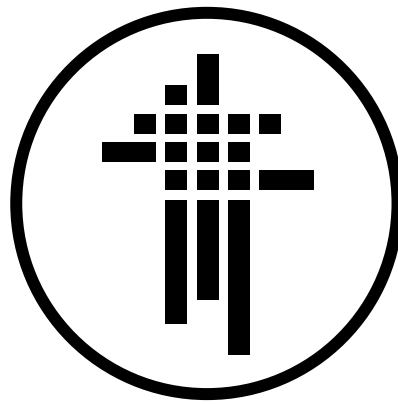
