The Pilgrim's Progress Simple Sloth and Presumption <u>Don't STOP</u> Running! Proverbs 24:30-34

I saw then in my dream, that he went on thus, even until he came at a bottom, where he saw,

- 1. A *little out* of the way, Prov. 4:23/Jer. 17:9/Prov. 28:1-8
- 2. Three men *fast asleep*, Prov. 6:4-11/Matt. 24:42-51
- 3. With *fetters upon* their heels. Gal. 5:7/1 Cor 9:24 Unable to RUN
- The name of the one was <u>Simple</u>, another <u>Sloth</u>, and the third <u>Presumption</u>. Prov. 1:21-32
- Christian then <u>seeing them</u> lie in this case went to them, if peradventure he might awake them, - Col. 1:28/Acts 20:27-31
- 6. And cried, You are like them that sleep on the top of a mast, Prov. 23:30-35
- 7. For the Dead Sea is under you a gulf that has no bottom. Is. 57:22
- 8. Awake, therefore, and come away. -1 Cor. 15:33-34/Eph. 5:14-18/Ps. 13:3
- 9. Be willing also, and I will help you off with your irons. Ps. 107:10-12
- 10. He also told them, if he goes about like a roaring lion comes by, you will certainly become a prey to his teeth. 1 Pet. 5:8-10
- 11. With that they looked upon him, and began to reply in this sort: Simple said, "I see no danger; Sloth said, "Yet a little more sleep;" and Presumption said,

Every vat must stand upon its own bottom; what is the answer else that I should give you? And so, they lay down to sleep again, and Christian went on his way. – Prov. 26:16

Yet was he troubled to think that men in that danger should <u>so little esteem</u> the kindness of him that so freely offered to help them, both by <u>awakening</u> of them, <u>counseling</u> of them, and <u>proffering to help</u> them off with their irons. -1 Thess. 5:1-8
