Malachi 2:13-14 (NIV)

¹³ Another thing you do: You flood the LORD's altar with tears. You weep and wail because he no longer looks with favor on your offerings or accepts them with pleasure from your hands. ¹⁴ You ask, "Why?" 2. Don't Compare Your Spouse with Someone Else

Key statement: Whenever we compare, we belittle.

Things to remember:

- o Comparison makes us ungrateful for what we have.
- o Comparison can make us critical of our spouse for no reason.
- Comparison causes us to focus on a person's negatives and not their positives.

Everyone has strengths and weaknesses, so *celebrate their strengths* and *give grace to their weaknesses*.

Philippians 2:3 (NIV)

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves...

3. Do Be Intimate Often

4. Don't Make Large Purchases without Consensus

- a. We tithe off every penny we get, because we want the blessing of God on our finances first.
- b. We don't have *his* money or *her* money. We have *OUR* money.
- c. We have one person manage the money who communicates everything to the other.
- d. We don't spend big amounts without agreeing (i.e., over \$100).

5. Do Laugh Always

Proverbs 17:22 (NIV)

A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones.

6. Don't Open the Door to Someone Who Is Not Your Spouse

1 Corinthians 13:3-8 (Message)

³⁻⁷ If I give everything I own to the poor and even go to the stake to be burned as a martyr, but I don't love, I've gotten nowhere. So, no matter what I say, what I believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love.

Love never gives up. Love cares more for others than for self. Love doesn't want what it doesn't have. Love doesn't strut, Doesn't have a swelled head.
