I. When You Are Planted, You Are Not Easily Moved.

- 1. Stronger roots
- 2. Access to nourishment
- 3. An opportunity to grow

¹⁰ I told you, 'I am the Lord your God. You must not worship the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you now live.' But you have not listened to me." ¹¹ Then the angel of the Lord came and sat beneath the great tree at Ophrah, which belonged to Joash of the clan of Abiezer. Gideon son of Joash was threshing wheat at the bottom of a winepress to hide the grain from the Midianites. ¹² The angel of the Lord appeared to him and said, "Mighty hero, the Lord is with you!"

III. When You Are Planted and Underqualified:

- 1. Hiding doesn't mean you are hidden.
 - God will find you! He will call you to conquer what you've been hiding from.
 - Your purpose has a tracking device.

- 2. God often ignores your questions to give His instructions.
 - Go with the strength you have.
 - o "...for we walk by faith and not by sight."
 - God will heal, change and transform us along the way.

4. The set back is a set up.

Judges 7:20-22 NLT

²⁰ Then all three groups blew their horns and broke their jars. They held the blazing torches in their left hands and the horns in their right hands, and they all shouted, "A sword for the Lord and for Gideon!" ²¹ Each man stood at his position around the camp and watched as all the Midianites rushed around in a panic, shouting as they ran to escape. ²² When the 300 Israelites blew their rams' horns, the Lord caused the warriors in the camp to fight against each other with their swords. Those who were not killed fled to places as far away as Beth-shittah near Zererah and to the border of Abel-meholah near Tabbath.
