Subjection

<u>Subjection</u> - One that is placed under authority or control; one subject to a monarch and governed by the monarch's law one who lives in the territory of, enjoys the protection of, and owes allegiance to a sovereign power or state that of which quality, attribute, or relation may be affirmed or in which it may inhere.

Powers

<u>Authority</u> - Power to influence or command thought, opinion, or behavior; persons in command; a governmental agency or corporation to administer a revenue-producing public enterprise

Submission

<u>Submission</u> - a legal agreement to submit to the decision of arbitrators an act of submitting something (as for consideration or inspection); also something submitted (such as a manuscript) the condition of being submissive, humble, or compliant; an act of submitting to the authority or control of another
