Genesis 11:1-9

Where have you seen God in creation this week?

1) The Setting

¹ Now the whole earth had <mark>one language</mark> and the <mark>same words</mark>. ² And as people migrated from the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there.

2) The Call to Action (Human Plans)

³ And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. ⁴ Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens,

3) Intended Results

and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth."

1') New Setting

⁵ The LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which mortals **had built.** ⁶ And the LORD said, "Look, they are one people, and they have all one language; and this is only the beginning of what they will do; nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them.

2') New Call to Action (God's Plans)

⁷Come, let us go down, and confuse their language there, so that they will not understand one another's speech."

3') Actual Results

⁸ So the LORD scattered them abroad from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. ⁹ Therefore it was called Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of all the earth; and from there the LORD scattered them abroad over the face of all the earth

Notice the nuanced structure, repetitions, word-plays, and irony.

We think of these stories in Gen 1-11 as children's stories, but the amount of work that went into creating these 9 verses, suggests that we might take it more seriously.
