RAME

Notice that prayer is described as a TWO-WAY relationship. That means we should find a way not just to talk but give space to listen during our prayer times.

Did you know there are over 650 prayers listed in the bible? There are prayers in the bible beginning in Genesis and listed all the way through to the last book in the Bible, Revelation. Question #2 Read Matthew 6:5-8 Read out loud versus 5-8 and then have a discussion with a friend. What does Jesus teach us about the attitude and posture of prayer? How does Jesus instruct us to pray?

Point Two. How to Pray

- Humility. An attitude of humility is important. Jesus said don't show off like the hypocrites, who pray aloud and with much pride and arrogance. Be humble when you pray.
- Prayer is Intimate. Jesus said, get alone, perhaps even in a closet.
 Find a special secret place and plan to meet with God intimately.



- Pray with Expectation. Jesus said our Father who sees you in secret will reward you. God likes to reward us and bless us. Expect good things from God, and expect answers when you pray.
- Your Words matter when you pray. Jesus said don't use a bunch of empty words. Speak plainly when you pray. Don't try to impress. Use language that is honest and truthful to who you are.

Question #3 Read Matthew 6:9-16 Read Jesus' prayer template and then answer these questions with a friend. What things are we encouraged to pray for in Verses 9-12

ACTS PRAYER

For some people, praying and connecting with God comes naturally. For others, this might be a new spiritual habit. If you would like assistance working on your prayer life, here is a simple acronym that can remind you of a good way to pray. The acronym is **A.C.T.S.** Here is what it stands for...

A Acknowledge God. Start your prayer by telling God of the many wonderful and powerful attributes he has.

C Confess Sin. Romans teaches us that all have sinned. 1 John encourages us to confess our sins. Allow confession to be a regular part of your prayer life.

T Thank God. It is good for the strengthening of our faith, and it's good for our hearts to be thankful.

S Supplicate. Supplication means to ask. Ask God what you need. Be open, be honest, be expecting and ask with faith.
