

Creed or Chaos?

Dorothy L. Sayers (1893 - 1957), graduated in 1915 with first class honors in medieval literature from Oxford University 1915. Soon afterward she would write a detective story "Whose Body" in 1923, which would become the first of 15 mystery novels featuring her sleuth Lord Peter Wimsey and the woman he loved throughout the stories: Harriet Vane.
