535 BC

After decades of captivity in Babylon, the Persian King Cyrus gave a decree that the Jews could return home. Led by Zerubbabel the governor, and Jeshua the priest God's people returned to Jerusalem. They quickly built an altar to offer sacrifices (Ezra 3:1-7) and collected offerings from the people to build a temple (Ezra 2:68-70) – 61,000 gold coins, 6,250 pounds of silver, and 100 priestly garments. They laid the foundation of the temple to great fanfare. They sang with praise and thanksgiving to the Lord, "For he is good, his faithful love to Israel endures forever." (Ezra 3:11). It was their time and they responded with generous giving, obedience, and praise.
