In 2013, he served as vice president of the SBC Pastors Conference. In 2014–15, Clint served as the first vice president of the SBC. He also has served on the board of trustees of The University of Mobile, the vice chairman of the board of trustees at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and is currently serving on the board of trustees at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary.

He is married to Connie LaBelle Smith Pressley and they have a son named Mack.


