- 4. If yes, then how did it turn out? If no, then what kept you from doing so then? What is keeping you from doing so now?
- 5. Can you remember a time when someone prayed for a sin you confessed? Beared that burden with you? Spurred you on to repentance? Encouraged you through the process?
 - a. If so what did one or all of those look like?
