- 4. Chris said, "So we should revel in the thought that God's discipline deepens our life with Him." What are your thoughts about this?
- 5. Chris asked, "How can we submit to God's discipline?" How would you answer this?
- 6. Chris said, "God won't quit on you. He may discipline you, but He doesn't walk away." Do you believe this? Do you embrace this? How have you personally experienced God not quitting on you? Describe.
