

SELFIES IN THE BATTLE, PART 2: GET YOUR FEET WET

We want God to do it all. We want God to do it all so that we won't have to do nothing. But God will only move in harmony with how we obey. God doesn't speak until we start moving to obey. God doesn't show us our next step to take until we step out and obey. We want God to show up and move for us. We want Him to obey for us. But that would alleviate our part in this process, because *God only hits a moving target*.

BIG IDEA: God won't move to save until you move to obey.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. When canoeing, camping, or fishing—what's your most memorable mishap?
- 2. What is your greatest fear? What would you attempt to do if you weren't afraid? If you knew it would succeed and could not fail?
- 3. With the Bible or Bible App, read <u>Joshua 3</u>.
 - 1 Early the next morning Joshua and all the Israelites left Acacia Grove and arrived at the banks of the Jordan River, where they camped before crossing. ² Three days later the Israelite officers went through the camp, ³ giving these instructions to the people: "When you see the Levitical priests carrying the Ark of the Covenant of the LORD your God, move out from your positions and follow them. 4 Since you have never traveled this way before, they will guide you. Stay about half a mile behind them, keeping a clear distance between you and the Ark. Make sure you don't come any closer." 5 Then Joshua told the people, "Purify yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do great wonders among you." 6 In the morning Joshua said to the priests, "Lift up the Ark of the Covenant and lead the people across the river." And so they started out and went ahead of the people. ⁷ The LORD told Joshua, "Today I will begin to make you a great leader in the eyes of all the Israelites. They will know that I am with you, just as I was with Moses. 8 Give this command to the priests who carry the Ark of the Covenant: 'When you reach the banks of the Jordan River, take a few steps into the river and stop there." 9 So Joshua told the Israelites, "Come and listen to what the LORD your God says. 10 Today you will know that the living God is among you. He will surely drive out the Canaanites, Hittites, Hivites, Perizzites, Girgashites, Amorites, and Jebusites ahead of you. 11 Look, the Ark of the Covenant, which belongs to the Lord of the whole earth, will lead you across the Jordan River! 12 Now choose twelve men from the tribes of Israel, one from each tribe. ¹³ The priests will carry the Ark of the LORD, the Lord of all the earth. As soon as their feet touch the water, the flow of water will be cut off upstream, and the river will stand up like a wall." ¹⁴ So the people left their camp to cross the Jordan, and the priests who were carrying the Ark of the Covenant went ahead of them. 15 It was the harvest season, and the Jordan was overflowing its banks. But as soon as the feet of the priests who were carrying the Ark touched the water at the river's edge, ¹⁶ the water above that point began backing up a great distance away at a town called Adam, which is near Zarethan. And the water below that point flowed on to the Dead Sea until the riverbed was dry. Then all the people crossed over near the town of Jericho. 17 Meanwhile, the priests who were carrying the Ark of the LORD's Covenant stood on dry ground in the middle of the riverbed as the people passed by. They waited there until the whole nation of Israel had crossed the Jordan on dry ground. Joshua 3:1-17 (NLT)
- 4. While waiting to cross the Jordan, what do you suppose the people were doing? Feeling? Praying? Anticipating?
- 5. 40 years ago, fear kept the Israelites from living in the promised land, and now they are confronted by a huge raging river of fear. What is your personal river of fear? How has fear kept you out of your promised land? How profoundly effective would you and I be if we decided to cross over our river of fear?
- 6. Read Joshua 3:1: "Then Joshua rose early in the morning; he and all the Israelites left Acacia Grove and arrived at the banks of the Jordan River, where they camped before crossing." What is the significance of Joshua getting up first thing and leaving?
- 7. God gave Joshua some instructions, and the first thing Joshua did was act immediately in obedience to God.

Contrast Joshua's act of obedience to Moses' interaction with God at the burning bush in Exodus 3 & 4. *Joshua made God first on his priority list.*

8. With your Bible or Bible App, read Matthew 6:33.

Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.

Matthew 6:33 (NLT)

9. What would happen if we woke up and made God the priority of our day? In our finances? In our marriage? In with how we parent our children?

Many times, we don't enter into a land of promise because we linger and delay obedience—we procrastinate obeying God by saying, "Let me pray about it." You and I never have to pray to be obedient. We don't have to pray, "Should I put God first in my family?" "Should I put God first in my bank account?" Many times, we use prayer as an excuse to get out of obeying God.

- 10. What does the Ark of the Covenant signify? (*Read Joshua 3:3-5, 11; Exodus 25:12, Numbers 4:5, 10:35-36, Deuteronomy 10:8, 31:26*) Why do you think they had to keep a half a mile back from the Ark?
- 11. What does Joshua's call to purify themselves involve? Prayer? Read the Bible? Stay silent? Cleansing? Confession? Start doing? Stop doing? Which one of these do you most need to do?
- 12. *Read Joshua 3:6-7*. When did God speak to Joshua? What did Joshua and the Israelites do before God started speaking?

God is not going to give you more information until you act on the information He has already given you. He isn't going to give you details about tomorrow if you haven't moved on the details He gave you yesterday. God is not going to show you step 7, if you still haven't done step 1. God is not going to give you the next step until you have stepped out in faith and start moving.

13. With your Bible or Bible App, read Psalm 119:105.

Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path.

Psalms 119:105 (NLT)

- 14. Why do you think the Psalmist uses the word lamp here? What are some characteristics of lamps and lanterns that are different than other sources of light? What does this lamp illuminate? How does it direct us? How can we see farther down the path when we have a handheld lamp? How do you keep your lamp on? Have you gotten burned out?
- 15. Read Joshua 3:7-8. Why did God inaugurate Joshua's career similar to the one He gave Moses?
- 16. Read Joshua 3:9-17 and Exodus 14. How are these circumstances similar? How are they different? Was this an instantaneous miracle? (Note: the city of Adam was located 16 miles upriver from Jericho and has experienced a dry riverbed on 2 other occasions: AD 1266 and 1927, both due to mudslides.)
- 17. Imagine you are one of the priests, holding this heavy ark above your head and your stepping into a raging Jordan river. You step in and your feet get wet, You keep on stepping and the water is around your knees. Now up to your waist? How do you feel? What do you fear? What do you think of Joshua's plan now?
- 18. Read Joshua 3:14-17. Why did God have the people cross the Jordan at the flood stage?
- 19. *Read Joshua 4:6-7, 21-22*. Why did Joshua ask the people to get stones and build an altar? Why 12 stones? (4:5; 3:12) Why from the river? Why two sets of altars: one in (or by) the river where the priests had stood (4:9), one taken to Gilgal (4:3, 19-20)?

THINK ABOUT IT

What are some areas that God has shown up and shown out in your past? Times when He has proven His faithfulness to you? As a group, take some rocks and write on them some of those events in your past, and make your own moment of God's faithfulness as a group by placing these stones in a glass vase or somewhere else to be displayed. This would also be a great interactive activity to do together with your family.

WHAT WILL YOU DO?

This would be a great time as a group to do communion together. Communion is the New Testament way for us to purify and prepare ourselves for God to move in some big ways. Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-24 and spend some time getting right with God personally.
