An oppressive government holds a tournament every year as a reminder of how impossible the odds would be for their citizens to rebel, but when two young heros are able to defy the wishes of the government during the tournament, they give their nation the one thing stronger than fear...

BIG IDEA: God's hope allows imperfect people to beat impossible odds.

SCRIPTURE:

13:32b"The land we passed through to explore is one that devours its inhabitants, and all the people we saw in it are men of great size. 33 We even saw the giants called the Nephilim there! To ourselves we seemed like grasshoppers, and they probably perceived us as weak and puny too." 14:1 Then the whole community broke into loud cries, and the people wept that night. 2 All the Israelites complained about Moses and Aaron, and the whole community told them, "If only we had died in the land of Egypt, or if only we had died in this wilderness! 3 Why is the LORD bringing us into this land to die by the sword? Our wives and little children will become plunder. Wouldn't it be better for us to go back to Egypt?" 4 So they said to one another, "Let's appoint a leader and go back to Egypt."

(Num 13:32-14:1-4, HCSB)

10 "As you see, the LORD has kept me alive these 45 years as He promised, since the LORD spoke this word to Moses while Israel was journeying in the wilderness. Here I am today, 85 years old. 11 I am still as strong today as I was the day Moses sent me out. My strength for battle and for daily tasks is now as it was then. 12 Now give me this hill country the LORD promised me on that day, because you heard then that the Anakim are there, as well as large fortified cities. Perhaps the LORD will be with me and I will drive them out as the LORD promised." (Josh 14:10-12, HCSB)

28 Do you not know? Have you not heard? Yahweh is the everlasting God, the Creator of the whole earth. He never grows faint or weary; there is no limit to His understanding. 29 He gives strength to the weary and strengthens the powerless. 30 Youths may faint and grow weary, and young men stumble and fall, 31 but those who trust in the LORD will renew their strength; they will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not faint. (Isa 40:28-31, HCSB)
