

STORIES THAT CHANGE EVERYTHING, PART 6: HUMBLE

Christianity is not a merit system–we are saved by grace through faith. Jesus tells a story about a religious fanatic and the Messy Christian. As we will see, if you compare yourself to others, you will always find someone **you think** you are doing better than. But when we compare yourself to **Jesus**? You will find yourself humbled quickly.

BIG IDEA: Humility is all about who you are looking at.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

* Remember the goal is to use the questions to generate discussion, not to complete every one.

1. With your Bible or Bible App, <u>read Luke 18:9-14</u>.

⁹ Then Jesus told this story to some who had great confidence in their own righteousness and scorned everyone else: ¹⁰ "Two men went to the Temple to pray. One was a Pharisee, and the other was a despised tax collector. ¹¹ The Pharisee stood by himself and prayed this prayer: 'I thank you, God, that I am not like other people—cheaters, sinners, adulterers. I'm certainly not like that tax collector! ¹² I fast twice a week, and I give you a tenth of my income.' ¹³ "But the tax collector stood at a distance and dared not even lift his eyes to heaven as he prayed. Instead, he beat his chest in sorrow, saying, 'O God, be merciful to me, for I am a sinner.' ¹⁴ I tell you, this sinner, not the Pharisee, returned home justified before God. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted." <u>Luke 18:9-14 (NLT)</u>

- 2. Discuss the character qualities you see in the Religious Pharisee. Which do you tend towards?
- Isolation from unchurched and churched "*I* thank God I'm not a sinner like everyone else."
- Condemning "I'm certainly not like that tax collector"
- Callous toward others' struggles "I thank God I'm not a sinner...swindler, unjust, adulterer."
- Entitlement "I fast and give you a tenth."
- 3. Discuss the character qualities you see in the Messy Tax Collector. Which do you see in you or saw in yourself when you first came to Jesus?

- Dirty "stood at a distance."
- Compared himself to God, not others "dared not even lift his eyes to heaven." Honest – "The sinner."
- Sorrow for sins "he beat his chest in sorrow."
 - Asked God for covering of sins "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."
- 4. How have you changed from when you first became a Jesus follower? (both positive and negative) In what ways should you return to your beginnings?
- *5.* Dave said, "Whether willingly humble or forcibly humbled, humility is inevitable." Do you agree or disagree? Why?
