- 8. Read **Matthew 6:24.** As a way to consider the principle Matthew introduces, on a scale of 1-10, how would you rate yourself when it comes to the following and why? Give =? Save =? Live =?
- 9. Read **1 Corinthians 16:2** and **2 Corinthians 8:12**. What do these verses tell us about generosity? What connection do they make between our hearts and our possessions?
- 10. Give some words that describe what you want your relationship with God to look like. How can putting God and others first in the area of your money help you take a step toward that kind of relationship?
- 11. What is one step you can take this week not to hold back from God?
