



## UNQUESTIONED ANSWERS, PART 1: THE CLOSER I GET TO GOD, THE MORE I'LL FEEL HIM

A lot of people stall out or quit their faith journey because they get discouraged. Some just grow disillusioned because as hard as they try to get close to God, they still don't feel connected. Isn't it true that the more you grow in your faith, the more you'll feel God's presence? But what if your spiritual connection isn't always reflected in your emotional condition?

**BIG IDEA: You can't equate your emotional condition with your spiritual connection.**

### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

*\* Remember the goal is to use the questions to generate discussion, not to complete every one.*

1. If you have made a decision to follow Jesus, think back to your assumptions about Christianity at the time you decided to follow Christ. Did you think that becoming a Christian would result in your life getting easier? Why or why not?
2. In what ways do we live in an 'emotional age?' How would you say your emotions impact your decisions?
3. Look at Paul's story as relayed in 2 Timothy 4:9-18.

*<sup>9</sup> Timothy, please come as soon as you can. <sup>10</sup> Demas has deserted me because he loves the things of this life and has gone to Thessalonica. Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus has gone to Dalmatia. <sup>11</sup> Only Luke is with me. Bring Mark with you when you come, for he will be helpful to me in my ministry. <sup>12</sup> I sent Tychicus to Ephesus. <sup>13</sup> When you come, be sure to bring the coat I left with Carpus at Troas. Also bring my books, and especially my papers. <sup>14</sup> Alexander the coppersmith did me much harm, but the Lord will judge him for what he has done. <sup>15</sup> Be careful of him, for he fought against everything we said. <sup>16</sup> The first time I was brought before the judge, no one came with me. Everyone abandoned me. May it not be counted against them. <sup>17</sup> But the Lord stood with me and gave me strength so that I might preach the Good News in its entirety for all the Gentiles to hear. And he rescued me from certain death. <sup>18</sup> Yes, and the Lord will deliver me from every evil attack and will bring me safely into his heavenly Kingdom. All glory to God forever and ever!

5. In the message, Chris said that we should never confuse our emotional condition with our spiritual connection. Has this ever happened to you? How did it impact your faith?
6. Paul still seems confident in his spiritual connection. *Read verses 16-18 again.* How do you think Paul maintained his confidence in Christ when everything seemed to be going against him? What parts of your emotional condition right now might make you feel like you are spiritually disconnected? In what ways does this passage help you see things differently?
