


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 4. What type leadership is exerted here in Exodus 17 by Moses? Joshua? Aaron and Hur? With what varying results?
- 5. 1 Timothy 2:2 says that "We are to pray for those in authority over us." How can you pray for the pastors here at oneChurch?
- 6. Do you agree with Chris when he says, "Nothing of significant value has been achieved by a lone individual?" Explain.
- 7. Why do you think people are hesitant about being on a team?
- 8. The idea of team-based leadership forces a solitary leader to admit some things about themselves and the situation. Name some of those things.
- 9. What challenges/problems do you currently face that would be easier if you were part of a team?


WHAT WILL YOU DO?
