- 3. Chris defined integrity as "*doing what you ought to do even if it costs you.*" Discuss your thoughts on this definition.
- 4. What did Chris mean when he said, "It's hard to build integrity alone"? Do you agree or disagree?
- 5. *With the Bible or Bible App, read <u>Proverbs 11:3</u>. Discuss your thoughts on this proverb.*
