In the movie *It's A Wonderful Life*, George Bailey has given up on his dreams. He's just about ready to end it all until his guardian angel named Clarence the Angel shows up and tries to instill hope into George by showing him all the lives that he has touched along the way. BIG IDEA: Jesus didn't just come to change history. He came to change your history.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. How would you like Jesus to impact your life?
2. How would you like your life to impact others?

3. Chris asked the question, "How different would the world be if Jesus had never been born?" Go around the group and rapidly throw out how our world history would be different with no Jesus. Try to keep your answers to concrete, non-spiritual answers. (Example: science, art, music, government, medicine, education, social welfare, culture, philosophy, human rights {treatment of women, children, the poor and suffering}, the naming of cities, and more.)
4. Everybody leaves some kind of legacy, but Jesus' impact was greater 100 years after his death than during his life. 500 years later? It was exploding all over the ancient world. 1,000 years later? His legacy eventually laid the foundation for much of Europe and eventually this nation—the United States of America. After 2000 years? Jesus has more followers in more places than ever before. That's impact. What do you think your legacy will be? How do you want your life and your death to change others in a lasting way?
5. John Ortberg wrote this:

Jesus' vision of life continues to haunt and challenge humanity. His influence has swept over history like the tale of a comet bringing his inspiration to art, science, government, medicine and education. He has taught humans about dignity, compassion, forgiveness and hope. His impact on the world is immense and non-accidental. It's in Jesus' name that desperate people pray, grateful people worship, and angry people swear. From christenings to weddings to sick rooms to funerals—it is in Jesus' name that people are hatched, matched, patched and dispatched. From the Dark Ages to postmodernity, He is the man who simply won't go away. It is in Jesus' name that desperate people pray, grateful people worship, and angry people swear.

7. *With your Bible or YouVersion, read 1 Corinthians 15:13-14, 17-19.*

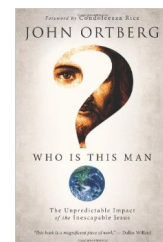

Knowing this, you might identify Jesus' influence on medicine or the treatment of children as especially beneficial to you.
10. Of all of the progress and revolutionary changes that can be traced back to Jesus, which do you think have become so woven into the fabric of contemporary life and culture that they are now perhaps taken for granted?
11. What difference has Jesus made in your life? What difference would Jesus like to make, but you're resisting Him and changing? Any attitudes or actions that need to change?
12. How would you like Jesus to impact your life? How would you most like Jesus to shape the person you are becoming?
