- Things for Saul went from really bad to fatal. They were after the king
- Jonathan could have become bitter, but became a friend to David
- Saul asked his armourbearer to kill him, but he was afraid and would not, so Saul fell upon his own sword
- When their leader died, the people panicked. They began to give up their power and territory
- The Philistines wanted their pagan gods to get the glory for the victory
- God always has the final say
- Fight for what is right and take a stand
- They had an encounter with God
- Our God is the only God who deserves any honor
- They knew that the God that delivered them deserved glory
- Don't neglect to obey what God has asked you to do
- Things happened quickly
