Devotional - Love and Unity

Consider your own relationships within the body of Christ. Are there any strained relationships you need to address? Reflect on how unity in the church can be a powerful witness to the world. Pray for the grace to "maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" in your local church and beyond.

Day 4: Advancing the Gospel

Reading: Philippians 1:12-18

Devotional: Paul saw his imprisonment as an opportunity to advance the gospel. Pastor Eric noted how Paul had an "apostolic mindset" of seeing the bigger picture. How do you view the challenges in your life? Are there ways you can reframe difficulties as opportunities for God's work? Consider how you might share your faith story, even in unlikely circumstances. Ask God to give you eyes to see how He might use your current situation for His glory.

Day 5: Hope in Suffering

Reading: Romans 5:3-5

Devotional: The sermon touched on the reality of suffering for Christ's sake. Today's passage shows how suffering can produce endurance, character, and hope. Reflect on a time when you experienced growth through hardship. How did it shape your faith? Remember that suffering is not pointless when viewed through the lens of God's greater purpose. Ask God for the strength to persevere and the wisdom to see His hand at work, even in difficult times. How can your response to trials be a witness to others of the hope you have in Christ?
