

1. Superhero Obstacle Course

Bibles

What You Need:

What You Do:

- Set up an obstacle course with at least five challenges.
- Create a start line and a finish line with floor tape.
- Gather the kids around the objects and point out the start line and the finish line.
- Walk through the course once to show them how to navigate each obstacle.
 - o Hop over the stack of Bibles, zig-zag around the trash can, etc.
- Let each kid take a turn traveling through the course from start to finish.
- After everyone has had a chance, reset the course and make a few changes.
- Demonstrate the new route and let the kids try again.
- Gather your group to discuss.

What You Say:

"That was VERY fun! You did a great job tackling the course—even when I made changes!

"Friends, you can trust that God has a plan, even when we don't know what's next. We live in the middle of the story—we still live in a broken world because Jesus hasn't come back yet. So sometimes we go through things that are really hard. We go through ups and downs just like Abraham and Sarah did.

"We can't see every single obstacle ahead of us, but God knows them, He is good, and He has a good plan we can trust! Try to remind yourself every day in the ups and downs that the good God is with you and [Bottom Line] you can trust that God has a plan!"

2. Puzzled

What You Need:

Bible marked at Hebrews 11:1
"Hebrews 11:1 Puzzle" Activity Page
Scissors
Zip-Top Sandwich Bags
Permanent Marker
Prepared Puzzle Example

What You Do:

- Choose a kid to open the marked Bible to Hebrews 11:1 and read the Memory Verse aloud.
- Repeat the verse together several times.
- Discuss any unfamiliar words with the kids.
- Give each kid a "Hebrews 11:1" Activity Page puzzle.
- Point out the Memory Verse, and lead the kids to read and recite it with you.
- Give each kid a pair of scissors, and direct them to cut along the lines to create a four-piece puzzle.
 - Have kids work together if they need help with cutting.
- Give each kid a zip-top bag so they can take their puzzle home.
- Use the marker to help kids write their name on their bag.

What You Say:

"The Bible, God's Word, is true! It teaches us more about who God is, how God loves us, and why Jesus came. It's good to memorize because it teaches us what is true! This verse is a good one to put in your heart because it reminds us this: Faith is trusting in what we can't see because of what we CAN see.

"We may not be able to see God with our eyes, but we can see all the things God has done! I mean, God made the world and everything in it, including us. God made some really big promises to Abraham and we saw them come true. God also promised to send a Savior—and God did! God made a way for us to have a relationship with Him through Jesus. God is not like a friend who might not keep a promise, God will ALWAYS keep promises, so we can trust Him no matter what.

"God had a plan for Abraham and Sarah—even when they couldn't see where they were going! Put this puzzle together at home and remember, even when you don't know what's next: [Bottom Line] You can trust that God has a plan."

- 1. What did God ask Abram and Sarai to do while they were living in the town of Harran? To pick up and more to an unknown place that God would lead them to.
- 2. Would you pick up and move from your home if God asked you?
- 3. What did Abram and Sarai do? They moved.
- 4. What did God promise to give them because of their faith? A baby.
- 5. What did God change their names to? Abraham and Sarah
- 6. Weren't they too old to have a baby? Yes- they were 100 and 90 years old.
- 7. What did they name their baby? Isaac
- 8. How did they know that God would do what He said He would?
