Community Group Questions: Isaiah 40: Romans 15

God's past faithfulness motivates our hope for the future. Biblical hope isn't a naive positivity for the future, but a matured perspective of faith that clings to God's promises while patiently waiting for them to come true

- As a child, what was a Christmas gift you remember hoping to find under the tree? Did you get it?
- What is a promise of God that you have put your hope in?

When we are weak, hope gives us strength (Isaiah 40:28-31)

- Talk about an area of your life, relationship, or situation that is making you (or has made you) feel powerless, weak, or tired.
- Why does that area of life, relationship, or situation make you feel that way?
- How can you put your hope in the Lord in this area of life? What would change or has changed when you did?

When we are empty, hope fills us up (Romans 15:13)

- · Describe what living on empty looks like for you?
- How in your day-to-day life can you be filled by the God of Hope?
- What would it look like at work and home to walk around Holy Spirit filled and overflowing with hope?

When we can't go any further, hope makes a way (Hosea 2:14)

- Is there a moment you remember being stuck, but God made a way?
- How does living surrendered to Jesus give you "a new birth into a living hope?" (1 Peter 1:3)
- How can you practically *live out hope* this week?

1 Peter 3:15 "you must worship Christ as Lord of your life. And if someone asks about your hope as a believer, always be ready to explain it."

• If someone where to ask you, how would you explain the hope you have in Jesus?
