Setting the Tone for the Experience

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, everybody! Come on in, find a seat, and get ready because we are about to have some fun today! Welcome to [Environment Name]! My name is [Host's Name], and I'm so glad you're here.

"Our series this month is called 'Frequency—Learning to Hear from God,' and this month, we're talking about something really important. We're talking about how we can hear from God and how listening to God actually changes our lives!

"Today, we're going to discover something huge: God has already given us a way to know Him, to hear from Him, and to learn what He's like. This might even be something you already have at home. But before we get into that, we're going to play a game.

"This is one I like to call ... Sword Drill!

GAME SLIDE 1: Sword Drill!

"Now, you might be wondering why our game today is called that. In the book of Ephesians, it says that God's Word is the 'sword of the Spirit.' That means the Bible isn't just a regular book. It's very powerful, alive, and active! It helps us know what's true, it guides us, and it helps us stand strong in our faith. So when we hold up our Bibles, like this (*hold Bible up*), it's kind of like we're holding up our 'sword' to fight against the darkness!

"Anyone who has a Bible, you get to play!

"Here's how it works. When I say, 'Swords up!' you'll hold your Bible up in the air. When I say, 'Go!' you'll open it and try to find what I call out as fast as you can. The first ones to find it will stand up, and we'll check if you got it right.

"Swords up! Find the book of Genesis ... GO!"

AUDIO: Upbeat music

(Play the game. Allow the kids to search in their Bibles, and when a few kids stand up, have two or three pre-determined leaders or the Host check the kids' Bibles. Celebrate a few winners.)

"Nice job! Genesis is the very first book of the Bible, and some of you found that fast! You guys are good at this!

(Continue with more rounds as time allows. Ideas for more rounds: finding another book of the Bible, like Matthew or Psalms, finding a specific verse, like the Memory Verse John 10:27, finding the name 'Jesus,' or finding the last book of the Bible—Revelation.)

"The classic sword drill never disappoints! Great job, everyone! You guys can close your Bibles and have a seat.

"That was awesome. You guys are quick! The Bible is something we get to learn from. It's actually one of the biggest ways we can know who God is. And that's actually our Bottom Line for today! Let's check it out.

[Bottom Line] "I can learn to know God through the Bible. Can you say that with me?"

KIDS AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "I can learn to know God through the Bible."

HOST: "Awesome job! We will be talking more about that very soon!"

What You Say:

AMAZING MUSIC

WORSHIP LEADER: "Hey, everyone! Have you ever heard an echo? Maybe you shouted in a big room, a tunnel, or outside somewhere, and your voice came right back to you.

"Our first song is called 'Echo,' and it reminds us that God's love keeps going. His love is not small. His love is not weak. His love is strong, steady, and always reaching us.

"When we know how much God loves us, His love can echo through us too—in the way we talk, the way we treat people, the way we forgive, and the way we show kindness. So let's stand up, sing out, and worship God for His amazing love!

SONG: "Echo" Dance Motion, Lyric or Instrumental Lyric Videos are available with Amazing Music on APlay

"That was awesome. Let me ask you something, have you ever had someone tell you something, and you weren't sure if you could trust it? Maybe a friend says, 'I promise, this is the best game ever,' and you're like, I don't know about that.

"Well, here's the cool thing: When God speaks, we can trust every single word He says. He's always good. He's always right. And when we worship, it's our way of responding to Him and saying, 'God, I trust You.'

"This first song is all about that—choosing to believe what God says and take Him at His word, even when it's not always easy. So don't hold back—let's sing this out together!

"That was some beautiful worship! Remember, worship isn't just something we do here—it's something that shapes how we live. When we focus on God, we start to see Him more clearly. And the more we see Him, the more we can know Him.

Take You at Your Word | Worship Song

"It's time to learn about our Memory Verse for the month! Let's break it down for a second. In this verse, Jesus was talking, and He was talking about sheep. He said His sheep know His voice. Now at first, that might sound kind of weird. But here's what He meant: Sheep know their shepherd. They recognize his voice. Through all the noise and all the other voices, they can tell which voice is their shepherd's, and they follow him.

"That means this isn't just about hearing a voice. It's about knowing the voice. There's a difference. You can hear noise all day long. But when you know someone, you recognize their voice right away.

"Here's our Memory Verse for this month. I'll read it first, then I will guide you through it. It's John 10:27!

SLIDE: Memory Verse

WORSHIP LEADER: *"My sheep listen to my voice. I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27 NIV).*

"Now, let me guide you through it. Repeat after me—nice and loud!

WORSHIP LEADER: *"My sheep listen to my voice."*

KIDS AND WORSHIP LEADER: *"My sheep listen to my voice."*

WORSHIP LEADER: *"I know them,"*

KIDS AND WORSHIP LEADER: *"I know them,"*

WORSHIP LEADER: *"and they follow me."*

KIDS AND WORSHIP LEADER: *"and they follow me."*

WORSHIP LEADER: *"John 10:27!"*

KIDS AND WORSHIP LEADER: *"John 10:27!"*

WORSHIP LEADER: *"So when Jesus said, 'My sheep listen to my voice,' He was saying we can actually learn to recognize Him and His voice. We can learn what He sounds like, what He cares about, and what is true because He speaks to us.*

"And then He said, 'I know them.' That means God doesn't just want you to know about Him. He knows you personally. He sees you. He cares about you. He's not distant, He's close.

"And then the last part, 'and they follow me.' That's the goal! Not just hearing or knowing about Jesus, but actually following Jesus! And when we do that, it changes how we live.

"Thanks for worshiping with me today, friends!"

What You Say:

INTRODUCTION

STORYTELLER: "Hey, everyone! I'm really glad you're here. All month long we're in this series called: 'Frequency—Learning to Hear from God.'"

"And we're going to learn something really important today: how we can actually know God.

"Let me ask you something: How do you get to know someone? You talk to them, you spend time with them, and you listen to what they say. That's how you become friends and get to know them better. And here's something amazing: God wants you to know Him! He's not far away. He's not hiding. He wants you to know Him. And one of the biggest ways He helps us do that is through the Bible.

"Now, the Bible is a big book with a lot of pages and a lot of stories. There is so much to learn and discover about God!

"And when we open the Bible, we're not just reading words ... we're learning who God is!"

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Think about this: What is the Bible actually for? Because when we understand that, everything starts to make more sense.

"The Bible isn't just a book we read sometimes. It's not just a list of rules, and it's not just a bunch of random stories. The Bible is how we get to know God. It helps us understand who He is, what He's like, and what He cares about. That's one of the most important reasons why He gave us the Bible. He wants us to know Him!

"The Bible is God saying, 'Hi, this is who I am.'"

"And that's a really big deal. The God of the universe wants you to know Him.

"So when you come to read the Bible, come with the expectation that you're going to get to know God better. You're not just learning information, you're learning about your friend. When you come to read the Bible, you can pray, 'God, I want to meet with you.' And He will. He loves to spend time with His friend."

What the Bible Is

STORYTELLER: "As we learn more about the Bible today, I brought a few different books with me, and I need your help. Let's take a look at them together.

(Pick up the storybook, and hold it up so the audience can see.)

"What kind of book do you think this is? Raise your hand to answer!

(Call on a few kids, and allow them to share responses.)

"Yeah, a storybook. What do you usually do with a storybook? You listen to the story and follow what's happening.

(Pick up the schoolbook, and hold it up so the audience can see.)

"What about this one? Raise your hand to answer!

(Call on a few kids, and allow them to share responses.)

"A schoolbook. What do you do with a book like this? You learn facts and new things.

(Pick up the how-to book, and hold it up so the audience can see.)

"And this one? Raise your hand to answer!

(Call on a few kids, and allow them to share responses.)

"A how-to book. It shows you how to do something step by step.

"So let me ask you something. Are all these books the same, or are they different? Call out your answer!

(Pause while the kids respond.)

"Yeah, they're different. They all have different purposes.

(Pick up the Bible, and hold it up so the audience can see.)

"Now, look at this. This is the Bible. At first, it might look like just one book, but it's actually made up of lots of books.

"Look at these three books. *(Gesture to the other three books on the table.)* Each one is different, but they all teach us something.

"The Bible actually has 66 books in it. Some books are stories, where you see what God has done. Some books are songs and prayers, where people talk to God. Some books are letters, where people teach others how to follow God. And some books are wise sayings that help us make good choices.

"So when you read the Bible, it might feel a little different depending on what book you're in. And that's okay! Each book has a purpose.

"But here's what makes the Bible really special: All of those different books come together to tell one big story. And that one big story is this: God loves you so much, He came to rescue you so you can be His friend forever! That's the story of the whole Bible!

"This true story starts at the very beginning with God creating the world. If you opened your Bible to the first book, you'll find Genesis. That's part of the Old Testament, which is the first section of the Bible. It tells the story of how God made the world, how the first people chose not to stay close to Him, but God promised to send a Rescuer so people could choose to come back to Him.

"Then, if you flip toward the end of the Bible, you'll find the New Testament. It starts with Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. These are called the Gospels, and they tell us about Jesus.

"Jesus is the Rescuer God promised. He came to save us and make a way for us to come back to God. Jesus is also God, so He came to show us what God is like!

"After the Gospels that tell about Jesus' life, we read about the early church, the first followers of Jesus. And there are also letters that were written to help people follow Jesus. So even though the Bible has lots of books, they all fit together as God's big story.

"Now, here's something that will really help you when you read the Bible. The Bible was later divided into chapters and verses. Chapters are like big sections, and verses are the smaller parts inside each chapter.

"So when someone says something like 'John 3:16,' they're telling you exactly where to find a verse in the Bible. The first number is the chapter, and the second number is the verse. That helps you find your place and read just a small part at a time.

"And remember, when you read the Bible, you're not just reading random stories. You're getting to know God.

"You don't have to know everything to start. One of the best places to start reading the Bible is the Gospels because they tell us about Jesus. You could also read Proverbs for wisdom or Psalms for prayers and songs.

"No matter where you start, the most important thing is that you start. Each verse and each chapter is like one small piece of a big picture. And as you read, you can pray, 'God, teach me more about who You are and how to follow You.'

What the Bible Does

STORYTELLER: "So now that we know what the Bible is, let's talk about what it actually does. Because the Bible isn't just something we read ... it actually does something in us.

(Open the Bible and read 2 Timothy 3:16-17 NIV.)

God has breathed life into all Scripture. It is useful for teaching us what is true. It is useful for correcting our mistakes. It is useful for making our lives whole again. It is useful for training us to do what is right. By using

Scripture, the servant of God can be completely prepared to do every good thing.

"These verses tell us something really important: The Bible isn't just a regular book. It says God breathed life into it. That means these words come from God. They're alive, and God uses them to speak to us.

"Because the words in the Bible are alive, they get in your heart and change you. They're not just black and white words, or words you hear in an audio Bible, God put life in them! Life that gets in your heart and changes you. Reading the God-breathed words of the Bible will change how you think, how you treat people, and how you live every day.

"This verse also tells us that the Bible teaches us what is true. That means that it tells us how the world works. It tells us that there is a God and He is in control of everything. It tells us who God is and what it looks like to follow Him.

"Because the Bible teaches us about who God is and His ways—including the ways that lead to life and goodness—the Bible also helps us understand what's true when we're not sure what's right or wrong. It corrects us when we get off track. After spending time in God's Word, we might think about something we've done and realize, 'Oh, this isn't something God would do or that God wants me to do. I need to go in a different direction.' The Bible will help us see our wrong choices, and helps us to turn back in the right direction.

"So the Bible isn't just information. It's not just something you read and forget. God actually uses it to shape you, guide you, and prepare you for the life He has for you.

"And the more time you spend in it, the more you start to recognize what is true, make wise choices, and follow God in your everyday life."

Depend on God Daily

STORYTELLER: "And God wants us to be fed by it daily. When Jesus taught us to pray, He said to ask for something specific.

(Open the Bible and read Matthew 6:11 NIV.)

"Give us today our daily bread."

(Hold up the loaf of bread.)

"When Jesus taught us to pray like that, He was teaching us to depend on God every single day. We don't just depend on Him once in a while. We ask Him to give us what we need for today.

"Daily bread is more than just food for our bodies. Yes, our bodies need food every day. But our hearts need things every day too.

(Take one slice from the loaf of bread, and hold it up so the audience can see.)

"You don't eat the whole loaf of bread at once. You take what you need for today, and tomorrow, you come back for more. In the same way, your heart needs what God provides each day.

(Hold up the Bible.)

"And one of the main ways God provides what your heart needs is through His Word, the Bible. When you open the Bible, you're not just reading stories. You're receiving truth. You're learning who God is. You're being reminded that He loves you and sent Jesus to rescue you.

(Hold up different slices of bread.)

"Some days, your heart needs courage. Some days, it needs comfort. Some days, it needs correction. Some days, it needs wisdom. God knows exactly what you need, and He gives it through His Word. He will feed your heart through the Bible!

"So when we pray, 'Give us this day our daily bread,' we're saying, 'God, give me what my heart needs today.' And one of the ways He answers that prayer is by feeding us through the words and truth in the Bible.

"You don't need the whole loaf. You don't need to understand everything at once. You just need today's slice.

"And when tomorrow comes, you come back again.

"That's how you grow close to God. Not all at once. But by daily opening up the Bible and letting Him feed your heart."

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "God wants you to know Him. Not just know about Him or hear stories about Him, but actually know Him in a real and personal way. And He hasn't made that confusing or impossible. He's given you a way to hear from Him and learn what He's like.

"He's given you His Word, the Bible. When you open the Bible, you're not just reading a book. You're taking a step to deepen a relationship. You're learning who God is, how much He loves you, and what is true. And every time you come back to it, even if it's just a little bit at a time, you are getting to know Him more and learning how to follow Him better.

"You don't have to have it all figured out. You don't have to understand everything right away. You just have to start!

"Our Bottom Line today talks about how we can get to know God through the Bible. Let's check it out!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "I can learn to know God through the Bible."

(Host enters and joins in.)

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: *[Bottom Line]* "I can learn to know God through the Bible."

What You Say:

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "Knowing God is not something far away or only for grown-ups. It's something you can begin right now. God has already made a way for you to know Him—it's the Bible! And He invites you to get to know Him more every day.

"You don't have to read a lot, and you don't have to understand everything right away. You can start small. You can make a simple plan to read just a little bit of the Bible each day, and as you do, you can ask God, 'Help me know You. Show me who You are.' And you can trust that He will meet you there.

"If you're still learning to read, that's okay. You can ask a parent or another grown-up to read with you or help you listen to the Bible. You don't have to do this alone. There are people around you who want to help you get started.

"You can talk to God about what you're learning and ask Him to help His words come alive for you and help you understand.

"And when you come across something that feels hard or doesn't make sense, don't stop. Keep going. Keep asking questions. Ask a grown-up who knows Jesus to help you. And keep coming back. Because every time you do, you're growing. You're learning. And you're getting to know God more.

"And over time, something will begin to change. You'll start to recognize what's true. You'll get to know God more. You'll start to live in His love more. You start to make wiser choices, not because you want to behave better, but because you love who God is and want to follow His ways.

"So this week, just take one step. Open your Bible, read a little, and trust that you're meeting with the God of the universe. When you read the Bible, it is a precious, precious moment. You are getting to know and meeting with the King of all.

"Let's take a moment and talk to the God who wants us to know Him."
