

Community Group Questions: Galatians 3:15-4:31

- 1) What is your first ever complete memory you can think of? Complete- meaning that you can even remember your emotions.
- 2) This week we spent a little time talking about how Paul was writing to a large and very diverse group of people in this letter. Because of this, he spends time attempting to make the same point in different ways with hopes that he can get his point across to all readers. Do you ever see this approach to communicate played out in today's world? Examples? Do you think this is an effective way to communicate your point or does it become repetitive and turn people off or away?
- 3) Why do you think Paul made the choice to bring Abraham into his letter? Do you think it could have backfired since Abraham made the choice to "kickstart" the blessing by not waiting for God? Have you ever tried to not wait for God to show up because you became impatient? How did that turn out?
- 4) We talked just briefly about "being heirs" Galatians 4:7. In your own words, what does that mean to you?
- 5). The concept of a "child of slavery" is a little uncomfortable to think and talk about. How do you think the metaphor of comparing a child of slavery and a child of promise helpful to the readers then and the readers now?
- 6) At the end of service, we talked briefly about it being ok to sometimes celebrate during communion. Since communion is usually a quiet and reflective experience does it seem awkward or even inappropriate to celebrate during this time?
