

Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways—as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings—and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passage for January 9 – January 14, 2017:

Acts 2:42-47

Monday, January 9, 2017

Read: Acts 2:42-47.

Reflect: This week your reflections will begin with Acts 2:42-47. You will spend time reflecting on the importance of Christians participating in small groups, where biblical community can best develop and grow.

Read Acts 2:42 a second time. Notice that the early Christians "devoted themselves to the apostles' teachings." The apostles revealed the teachings of Jesus, the teachings of the Scriptures (the Old Testament at that time), and the spiritual instructions they were receiving through inspiration from the Holy Spirit. How do you devote yourself to something similar?

Make a list of Bible teachers who have especially influenced your spiritual growth. Offer a prayer of thanks for them.

Read Acts 2:42 again. Notice the early Christians also devoted themselves "to the breaking of bread" (mostly likely a meal and the Lord's Supper) and prayer. How do you participate in this ritual today?

Tuesday, January 10, 2016

Read: Acts 2:42-47.

Reflect: The relationship the early Christians had with one another included being together regularly, having all things in common, meeting in the temple, meeting in homes ("breaking bread" probably means having a meal together), and praising God together. When and where do you participate in the same things today?

Read Acts 10:23-33; Acts 16:14-15,40; and Acts 16:25-34. Compare these passages to Acts 2:42-47. What spiritual revelations come to the forefront?

What is the most important revelation for you from these passages?

Wednesday, January 11, 2016

Read: Acts 2:42-47.

Reflect: Think about the sense of unity these early Christians experienced. Now read Genesis 1:26-31 and reflect upon the unity between God and humanity that is revealed in these verses. What do you think the statement "Let us make man in our image" refers to? What does it mean to you?

Read Ruth 1:8-18. What does this passage reveal about the depth of a spiritual relationship? What does such a relationship entail? With whom do you have this kind of relationship?

Write a prayer of gratitude for the people with whom you have a deep spiritual bond.

Thursday, January 12, 2016

Read: Acts 2:42-47.

Reflect: Today you'll reflect upon the unity God desires for His people. Read Ephesians 2:11-22. In what ways did the lessons in this passage impact the behavior of the Christians identified in Acts 2:42-47? What is most important to you from all of these passages?

Read John 17:11, 20-23. What is Jesus' primary desire for His people in this prayer? What were the people mentioned in Acts 2:42-47 doing to fulfill Jesus' desire?

Friday, January 13, 2016

Read: Acts 2:42-47.
Reflect: Read Matthew 28:19-20. How was the early church fulfilling this commission from Jesus?
Where are you fulfilling this today?
Read Acts 6:1-7. Notice the concern for shared responsibilities of ministry in the early church as well as the results of their shared ministry. Where does this kind of shared ministry occur today?
Read Acts 2:47; 6:7. What do these two verses have in common? Write a prayer that our church would experience what this early church experienced.

Saturday, January 14, 2016

Read: Acts 2:42-47.
Reflect: Read 1 Corinthians 10:14-17. What is the meaning and symbolism of one cup and one bread? What does this mean for you and for our church?
Read Ephesians 4:1-7. What do you believe is the most important lesson from this passage for you and for our church?
Read Romans 12:1-5. What do you believe is the most important lesson from this passage for you and for our church?
In light of your reflections this week, finish the following sentence: I believe God wants me to
in order to grow and mature in my faith in relationship with the people in my church and in my Base Camp (small group).

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week three of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, <u>mixed</u>, invitation/service.

Preparation: As a group, spend time in prayer, preparing your hearts and minds for what God has in store during this time.

Mixed: This week, focus on hearing and sharing what God is doing in your group. Remember that God wants to speak through you and use those around you to speak to you. Take time to listen and help others share and process what God is doing.

Spend some time as a group discussing what God has pointed out to you this week through the Compass and through your quiet times.

What is holding you back from spending time in the apostles' teaching?

Why is deep community and fellowship important? What fruits have you seen from spiritual fellowship? How can you make these fruits grow?

What is holding your group back from deeper spiritual fellowship?

Spend time engaging in each others' lives through prayer. How can you support each other?


