Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Genesis 3:8, Genesis 6:9, John 17:20-23, James 2:22-23, Galatians 5:22-23, John 10:4, 14 and 27, Galatians 3:24, Micah 6:8, John 15:15.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 8/29/16 – 9/3/16: Genesis 2:2-3, Exodus 20:8-11, Mark 2:27, and Matthew 12:1-8.

Monday, August 29, 2016

Read: Luke 10:38-42.

Reflect:

Why do you think Jesus affirmed Mary's decision to sit and listen, not Martha's decision to serve?

Is there something wrong with working, serving, attending to your duties in life? If not, why did Jesus fail to praise Martha?

In what circumstances do you feel you need to serve, work, tend, care, etc? Do you ever get the impression that you should take a break from serving, working, etc., to just sit and listen to what God might have to say?

What do you think about setting aside a time each week to stop busying yourself? Instead, sit and listen to what God might have to teach you.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Tuesday, August 30, 2016

Read: Genesis 2:1-3.
Reflect: Do you suppose God was tired after six days of creation?
Read Isaiah 40:28. If God does not grow weary, why would He have rested on the seventh day? What value could there be in this rest?
What might God be saying to you by resting on the seventh day?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Wednesday, August 31, 2016

Thursday, September 1, 2016

Read: Mark 3:1-6.
Reflect: Has Jesus violated the Fourth Commandment (that you read on Wednesday)?
Why do you think Jesus is willing to disobey the Pharisee's law and heal on the Sabbath?
Read Matthew 12:1-8. What does Jesus mean when He says "The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath?"
Spend a moment thinking about Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. In what way is Jesus "greater than the temple?" (Matthew 12:6)
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Friday, September 2, 2016

Read: John 1:29-31 and Revelation 5:1-6.

Reflect:

Revisit the questions from Thursday. In light of these verses from John and Revelation, think again for a moment about what Jesus means when He says, "something greater than the temple is here".

The Old Testament temple was a place of sacrifice. In light of today's verses, how is Jesus a greater sacrifice than those of the Old Testament?

Read Matthew 5:17. In what ways has Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament law?

How does this help to explain Jesus' statement, "The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath"?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you this week, and how might you put them into practice?

Saturday, September 3, 2016

Read: Mark 2:23-28.

Reflect:

Mark's account is similar to Matthew's (Matthew 12:1-8). In Mark's account, Jesus states, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath." What does Jesus mean by this?

In Genesis 2:1-3 (from Monday's reading), God rested from His work as an example for you. How does this help explain why Jesus says the Sabbath was made for man?

Take a moment to consider what distractions might be keeping you from resting in God's presence—as Martha's distractions kept her from the feet of Jesus (Luke 10:38-42). List a few such distractions here.

How can you commit to rest from these distractions? What time can you dedicate to God in the next week, simply to quietly rest?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you this week, and how might you put them into practice?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week one of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: <u>intergenerational</u>, adult study, mixed, invitation/service.

Prepare: Read 1 Samuel 3:1-11.

Intergenerational:

Ask everyone (especially the kids):

- Have you ever been bored?
- When you feel bored, what's the first thing you want to do?
 - You will probably get a pretty broad list in response. The broader, the better!
- Have you ever thought of just sitting quietly and listening?
- Sometimes God speaks to you in a still, small voice.
- Depending on the age group, you might consider paraphrasing the story of how God called Samuel (1 Samuel 3:1-11).
 - Samuel had to quietly rest to hear God's voice. Then he had to respond.
 - It's possible that God may want to speak to you, but you won't be able to hear Him through distractions.

Close in prayer. Explain in advance that you're going to leave some extra time for quiet prayer so that everyone has a chance to listen to God. If God puts a prayer into your heart during that time, you should be encouraged to pray it aloud in the group.

If Base Camp is meeting on a Sunday, consider ending a little early so families can go home and enjoy some additional rest on this Sabbath day.


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Mission and Vision
