The Compass Guide

If you're new to The Compass, welcome! Here is a short overview to keep in mind before you get started.

Advance Preparation

At the Ascent Church, we help you prepare in advance to worship together. Throughout the week we study the passage(s) that is (are) the focus for the upcoming Sunday. This allows the whole church to engage God's Word before we join together for worship and to hear God's Word preached.

Deeper versus Broader

We use one Bible passage in different environments to allow the passage to impact us in a variety of ways. It's not simply for study. It's for discussion in community and application. Remember, depth and maturity are not measured by new information or ideas. Depth is life change. One passage in different environments allows for a greater opportunity to have the Word of God go deep. The first question on the daily pages is one that may be helpful for group discussion, discussions with newer Christians, or for discussion with children or other family members.

Use versus Do

One trap related to a tool like *The Compass* is that people start to "do" it and then measure their success (and their guilt!) based on whether or not they "did" it. The Compass is simply a resource. If you use this to grow in your faith as an individual and in community, God will honor that. If you miss a few days, move on. *Use* the resource. Don't *do* it.

Transformation versus Education

Our goal with *The Compass* is to let the Word of God transform you. It's not so you can know more. It's so you can BE more like Jesus. So use the resource. Saturate yourself. Become more like Jesus every day as an individual and as a community! Let's grow together!

Passages for 10/19/2015 through 10/24/2015

Acts 2:36-41.

36 "Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." **37** Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" **38** And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. **39** For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself." **40** And with many other words he bore witness and continued to exhort them, saying, "Save yourselves from this crooked generation." **41** So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls.

Monday, October 19, 2015

Read: Acts 2:36-41.

Reflect:

When Peter told the crowds the great good news about the Lord Jesus Christ, they were "cut to the heart." Why was this a message that "cut to the heart?"

When or how are you "cut to the heart?"

What effect does God's Word have in your life?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Journal about how you are "cut to the heart" or "disturbed by God." How did this come about? What did it look like for you to be so disturbed--Joy? Conviction? Peace? Hunger?

Tell another person this week about how God reaches and transforms you through His Word.

Tuesday, October 20, 2015

Read: Acts 2:37b, 38 & 41; Mark 5:18-20.

Reflect:

When the crowds were "cut to the heart" by Peter's message, they immediately wanted to know what to do, and responded. Including what's in these verses and other Bible passages, write some possible responses to the gospel.

Why do repentance, baptism, the Holy Spirit and forgiveness appear together in verse 38? What is their relationship?

How does the Holy Spirit come to you and work through and in you? What was the Holy Spirit's role at your own baptism?

How is the demon-possessed man's testimony after healing like your baptism? How is it different?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Do you have the sense of urgency in response to the gospel like those in Acts? Like the demon-possessed man? Why or why not?

What can you share or declare about your salvation this week?

Wednesday, October 21, 2015

Read: Acts 2:36 & Romans 10:9-10.

Reflect:

Acts 2:36 has the "simple" message to the crowds that Jesus was Lord and Christ, and Romans 9 has the "simple" message of confessing Jesus as Lord and believing He was raised from the dead. Are these really "simple" truths?

Write what it means for you that He is Lord:

Write what it means for you that He is the Christ, the Messiah, raised from the dead: (i.e. Why does being raised from the dead matter? Why did He die?)

Why are repentance and baptism natural responses to Peter's message?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Meditate on "how much the Lord has done for you, and how He has had mercy on you." (Mark 5:19)

Consider repentance and baptism as your own responses to your Lord and Savior.

Thursday, October 22, 2015

Read: Romans 7:21-8:2 & Romans 6:1-7.

Reflect:

The passage in Acts from this week talks about repentance from sin and receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit at baptism. How do Paul's words in Romans connect with repentance and the Holy Spirit?

How do you rely on the Holy Spirit?

How have you died to sin?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Praise God for delivering you from sin.

Ask God for the counsel of His Holy Spirit to fill you with the joy of your salvation and a contrite heart.

Friday, October 23, 2015

Read: Acts 2:36-41, focusing on v. 41.

Reflect:

Why did Peter's message have such a profound effect on people in that day?

How can you preach God's message of repentance and baptism?

What impact has your baptism had on you? On others?

What testimony or truth can you give to others about baptism, repentance or the Holy Spirit? Can you have an effect like Peter? Why or why not?

Consider the Great Commission of Matthew 28:19-20. What does this mean for you as a 21st Century believer?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Consider sharing the news of our upcoming baptism service with someone in your Base Camp or neighborhood.

Saturday, October 24, 2015

Read: Acts 8:34-38 & Act 2:36-41 & Romans 10:14-15.

Reflect:

Both the eunuch from Acts 8 and the crowds from Acts 2 recognized a great truth revealed to them, and responded enthusiastically in baptism and confession of Christ as Lord. Tomorrow is our baptism service. Think about how those people who will be baptized heard the great truth of the gospel. Write your thoughts here.

Who is your "eunuch on the desert road?" How is God calling you to that "desert road?"

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Pray God will prepare you for the service tomorrow and would touch your heart and mind, and the hearts and minds of others, as you witness the baptisms.

Share your thoughts about the baptisms with your Base Camp.

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week four of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps, focused on the "overflow" of our lives as believers.

Read: Read Acts 2: 14-41 and Romans 6:1-7 What are your initial thoughts upon reading Peter's sermon and response from Acts 2? What stands out to you?

Reflect:

When Peter told the crowds the great good news about the Lord Jesus Christ, they were "cut to the heart" or "stunned." Why was this a message that "cut to the heart?" How are you "cut to the heart?"

To repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus means to turn from sin and follow Jesus with all of your life. How is this challenging to you?

How do Paul's words in Romans 6 connect with repentance and the Holy Spirit? How have you died to sin?

Respond:

Why could Peter's message have such an impact on people in that day? What facts about Jesus are key for non-believers to understand (vv.29-33)?

What impact has your baptism had on you? On others?

When was the last time you took an opportunity to tell someone about Jesus, repentance, and perhaps your own story and baptism?

Can you have an effect like Peter?

Consider the Great Commission of Matthew 28:19-20. What does this mean for you as a 21st century believer?
