Explore II



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways—as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings—and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

Monday, December 5, 2016

Read Joshua 6:20-21; 8:24-25.

What does the defeat of Jericho and Ai suggest God's people should have expected as they sought to take possession of the Promised Land? How does this correspond to Joshua 1:1-5?

Read Matthew 28:18-20 and 2 Timothy 4:5.

What should be your expectation as you seek to fulfill God's call? How is this task accomplished?

Read Joshua 9:1-2 and John 16:33.

In addition to an expectation of success, what other expectations should inform our lives of service, ministry, and mission?

Identify a friend, neighbor, coworker, or any person you wish to lead to faith in Christ; pray for them and for your heart to become fully expectant for God's work in you.

Tuesday, December 6, 2016

Rea	d.	Joshua	9.2-	16
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While other groups banded together against Israel, what did the inhabitants of Gibeon do? Do you think this was a good tactic? Is it true that all is fair in love and war? Do you blame the Gibeonites for attempting their deception?

List the emotions you have felt when you have been deceived.

What counsel might you give someone who has been deceived?

Meditate on Psalm 109. Record your thoughts below.

Wednesday, December 7, 2016

Read Joshua 1:7-9; Deuteronomy 7:1-4; Joshua 9:14-15.

Trickery is terrible, no doubt. However, who does the failure belong to?

What kind of spiritual life does it require to "ask counsel from the Lord" in political circumstances such as these? What kind of spiritual life makes it difficult to seek that counsel?

What does this reveal about the people and/or Joshua's leadership at this time?

Read Psalm 1:1-3.

After reading this meditatively a few times, name two or three spiritual routines believers should practice regularly.

Share with your Base Camp, your Bible study, or a believing friend your success with these practices or your desire to engage in them more fully.

Thursday, December 8, 2016

Read Joshua 9:16-25.
Who first confronted the Gibeonites? Were they right to do so?
What was Joshua's response? What was unique about his response, differentiating it from the people's response?
What might one who has been cursed expect? By what authority—if any—does Joshua curse the Gibeonites?
What was the balance of Joshua's response? Why is this significant?
Read Matthew 5:43-46.
What prayers should you offer on behalf of those who have

deceived or betrayed you? What is the fruit of these obedient and

humble prayers?

Friday, December 9, 2016

Read Galatians 5:22-23 and Joshua 9:24-27.
Which fruit of the Spirit does Joshua demonstrate in his response?
Who benefited from the punishment Joshua gave to the Gibeonites? What motivated Joshua's choice of punishment?
What does this say about Joshua's leadership?
Read Luke 6:28 and your answers to Wednesday's final question.
What is essential in your own spiritual practice?
Who is coaching, holding you accountable, or praying for you as you engage in these practices?
Take at least 10 minutes to practice those things you think might intensify your spiritual attention to the Lord.

Saturday, December 10, 2016

Read Deuteronomy 5:1-21 and review Joshua 9:1-27.
What does Moses tell the people they should do with God's instructions?
In light of this week's readings, what does it mean to "learn" the 10 Commandments?
What does it mean to "be careful to do them" (the Commandments)?
How would learning and applying God Word help you overcome another's deception?
Review notes from the final questions on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday.
What has God revealed to you this week?
How vulnerable do you feel to deception? Would you be able to overcome it?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

Preparation

Find a graphic of the 10 Commandments and the Lord's Prayer to print for each child in your Base Camp. Bring colored pencils.

Intergenerational Element

Have the younger children read the 10 Commandments from the sheets you prepared. Focus on "you shall not bear false witness against your neighbor" or its traditional rendering, "You shall not lie." Ask members to share what it feels like when someone lies to them. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

Adult Study

Read Joshua 9. What would have been your reaction after discovering the Gibeonites had betrayed you?

The Law of Moses prevented Israel from backing out of their covenant and from killing those who deceived them. Discuss what it's like when one part of God's Word places a constraint on another.

Joshua found the way for himself and God's people to take the high road. Given what they still had to do to possess the Promised Land, what is the significance of this choice?

What happens when you fail to make this choice (see Joshua 7:1-2; 10-12)?

What should orient your response to the deceptions of others?

Conclude Base Camp with prayer for the next step each person may need to take to respond to betrayal, deception, or lies.

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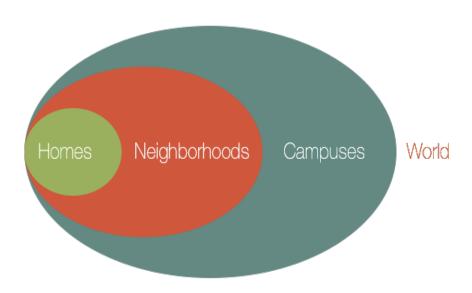
