

Message Notes

Sermon Passage: Psalm 150.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass begins devotions on Monday and leads up to the Sunday which will focus on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us, not biblical information itself. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's devotion. Rather, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on and seek growth; God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 1/25/16–1/30/16: Psalm 23.

Monday, January 25, 2016

Read: Psalm 23 slowly and prayerfully 1. What stands out to you as you read Psalm 23 today?

2. Why do you think this item caught your attention?

Reflect:

1. Spend time in reflection about how and why this Psalm provides you comfort personally.

2. Many people are familiar with this Psalm and have memorized it. Why do you think Psalm 23 in particular appeals to such a wide audience?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

1. Look inward now, search your heart and write below the trials and transitions you are going through and the worries and fears you feel.

2. Now that you have completed your list, symbolically release and lay these at the foot of our Shepherd.

Tuesday, January 26, 2016

Read: Psalm 23.

Reflect:

1. Think back to your list of trials, transitions, worries, and fears listed yesterday. Is there anything else that should be added to the list? If so, go back and write it in.

2. How successful were you at leaving your listed items in the care of the Shepherd? Surely, you'll need to symbolically release and lay all of these items at the foot of our Shepherd again.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

1. What is it in human nature generally, and in you specifically, which makes it difficult <u>not</u> to try to solve problems on your own?

2. What have been the events in your life which have caused you to turn to God for help?

3. What are alternatives to solving problems in your own power and strength?

Wednesday, January 27, 2016

Read: Psalm 23 two times.

Reflect:

Fill in the table below with how the Lord's identity and actions influence you.

Thursday, January 28, 2016

Read: Psalm 23.

Reflect:

As you read Psalm 23, what specific characteristics and attributes do you discover about God (ex. loving, powerful, sovereign)? Write them below and then circle the two that give you the most peace in your current situation.

Friday, January 29, 2016

Read: Psalm 23:6.

Reflect:

1. As you focus on Psalm 23:6 today, what promises in this verse do you find comforting?

2. Read this verse in other translations (for help, go to www. biblegateway.org). What additional blessing do you find in these words?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

1. Write below a paraphrase of this verse and personalize it by putting in your own name.

2. Pray to God a prayer of thanksgiving, while keeping in mind the trials and transitions you are experiencing (from Monday).

3. How has your view of your trials and transitions changed in light of your reflections on Psalm 23?

Saturday, January 30, 2016

Read: Psalm 23 again, this time with a focus on community, such as your street, workplace, classroom, extended family, or church.

Reflect:

How do you think Psalm 23 speaks to the troubles we experience together in community?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

1. Pick one of the communities you participate in and consider the troubles, trials, and transitions—along with worries and fears found among the members of that community. Paraphrase Psalm 23 below and personalize it for the community you chose.

2. With whom will you share the paraphrase you wrote?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This week with your Base Camp family we continue in our study of the Psalms. Our focus this week is on Psalm 23.

During your gathering time, include all ages and read Psalm 23 in smaller groupings. Answer the question "How has God comforted you in your life?" For the rest of your Base Camp meeting time, focus on adult discussion, including middle and high school students. Make sure to have a purposeful activity for younger children.

Re-read Psalm 23. Many people are familiar with this Psalm and have memorized it. Why do you think it appeals to such a wide audience?

How do you tend to deal with fatigue, stress, and anxiety? How do your methods compare with what we read in this Psalm?

What dark valleys (trials, transitions, worries or fears) are you currently going through? How might you call on our Great Shepherd to protect and guide you?

What green pastures and still waters has God brought in your life? How can these times be an encouragement for others and ourselves?

Focus on Psalm 23:6. What does "dwelling" mean to you? What promises in this verse do you find comforting?

Close your meeting time by praying for each other, keeping in mind the dark valleys shared in the discussion. Pray for a realization of the LORD as shepherd in our lives, in all situations.

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
