

The Compass Guide

If you're new to The Compass, welcome! Here is a short overview to keep in mind before you get started.

Advance Preparation

At the Ascent Church, we help you prepare in advance to worship together. Throughout the week we study the passage(s) that is (are) the focus for the upcoming Sunday. This allows the whole church to engage God's Word before we join together for worship and to hear God's Word preached.

Deeper versus Broader

We use one Bible passage in different environments to allow the passage to impact us in a variety of ways. It's not simply for study. It's for discussion in community and application. Remember, depth and maturity are not measured by new information or ideas. Depth is life change. One passage in different environments allows for a greater opportunity to have the Word of God go deep. The first question on the daily pages is one that may be helpful for group discussion, discussions with newer Christians, or for discussion with children or other family members.

Use versus Do

One trap related to a tool like *The Compass* is that people start to "do" it and then measure their success (and their guilt!) based on whether or not they "did" it. The Compass is simply a resource. If you use this to grow in your faith as an individual and in community, God will honor that. If you miss a few days, move on. *Use* the resource. Don't *do* it.

Transformation versus Education

Our goal with *The Compass* is to let the Word of God transform you. It's not so you can know more. It's so you can BE more like Jesus. So use the resource. Saturate yourself. Become more like Jesus every day as an individual and as a community! Let's grow together!

Passages for 9/28/2015 through 10/03/2015

Genesis Chapter 3, Jeremiah 29:1-14, Luke 10:25-37, Genesis 1:27-28, Romans 1:24-28 and John 8:1-1.

Monday, September 28, 2015

This week we will review several of the passages we explored over the past three weeks. This week's reflections will serve as preparation to hear from four Christian college students on Sunday who will share their thoughts and observations regarding these same topics.


Read: Genesis Chapter 3 (focus on verses 17-24).

Reflect: Read Genesis 2:16-17. Write down, in your own words, what God's instructions were to Adam and Eve, and what were the consequences of violating those instructions.

Now, reflect upon Genesis Chapter 3 and notice the process that transpires as Adam and Eve ponder God's instructions and choose to violate them. Write down where you see this same behavior occurring today.

Identify specific ways life and culture are producing "thorns and thistles" for us today?

Tuesday, September 29, 2015



Wednesday, September 30, 2015

Read: Luke 10:25-37.

Reflect: Examine each character in the story. Google search "Samaritans" and their relationship with Jews.

What is significant about the attitude the Jews had toward the Samaritan?

What cultural obstacles did the Samaritan overcome to help the person in need on the side of the road?

The Samaritan was identified as a good neighbor because he saw the wounded man as a neighbor. Would you consider yourself a good neighbor? Why? Who are the people in your life you see as your neighbors?

Thursday, October 1, 2015

Read: Luke 10:25-37.
Reflect: List types of people and issues we see today which could be metaphorically represented in the man on the side of the road?
What are ways you can exhibit the traits and attitude of the Samaritan to people you encounter?
What prejudices, attitudes or traditions will you have to overcome in order to help someone you consider different than yourself?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Friday, October 2, 2015

Read: Genesis 1:27-28 and Romans 1:24-28.

Reflect: What does the Bible say about God's design for sexuality and gender? Write down your thoughts based upon the Scriptures.

Do you believe being homosexual is sinful, even if no homosexual acts take place? Why? Why not?

Do you believe homosesexual activity is sinful? Why? Why not?

Now, read Romans 1:29-32. Below, write the word "Homosexuality" then list a sin (or sins) from the list you just read with which you battle in your own life. What do we need remember about building a hierarchy of sins?

Saturday, October 3, 2015

Reflect: This woman was caught in a "sexual" sin listed right along with homosexuality in the law of their time. What was Jesus' response to this woman and her sin?

Read: John 8:1-11 (pay attention to vs 11).

How does Jesus approach us and our sin? Are their similarities to His approach to the woman? List some adjectives or observations regarding Jesus' approach to sinners and their sin.

What is important about the "order" in which Jesus responded to her in verse 11? (Hint: break apart sentence and list in order of interaction.)

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week one of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: <u>intergenerational</u>, adult study, mixed, invitation/service.

Prepare: Before dinner, give each child a sheet of white paper and some markers/crayons. Ask the teens to help the children create a picture using the word "LOVE".

Intergenerational: All the children will display their "LOVE" pictures. Ask the teens and adults to comment on the pictures. Ask everyone in the group to close their eyes and think about someone they love. Ask the group if someone chose their mom or dad. Ask who chose a special friend or their pet.

God wants us to love our mom, dad, friends, pets, etc. ALSO, GOD WANTS US TO LOVE OTHER PEOPLE; EVEN PEOPLE THAT WE MAY NOT LIKE VERY MUCH!! God wants us to love our neighbor. Read and summarize Luke 10:25-37. In this Bible story God teaches us to love like Jesus loves and to express our love with action, not just words. Ask the children/teens to listen for the names of three people--Priest, Levite, and Samaritan. Who loved like Jesus loves?

Conclude your time together with the following True/False exercise:

I will continue watching my favorite show, even though someone needs my help.

I will help my unfriendly neighbor clear off their driveway after a snowstorm.

(Ask each family or person to come up with more true/false statements concerning loving our neighbors and loving those that we may not like very much) Spend time praying for others.
