Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

Message Notes

Sermon Passage: Psalm 96.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 3/7/16–3/12/16: Psalm 145.

Monday, March 7, 2016

Read: Psalm 145 is a dynamic hymn/prayer filled with emotions of authentic love, adoration, and praise for God. In the Hebrew language, it's a structured composition flowing from an acrostic, where essentially each verse begins with successive letters of the Hebrew alphabet.

Read Psalm 145, slowly. Notice the many attributes of God. Now, read the Psalm aloud. Record any impressions you formed from the contrast of reading the Psalm silently and then aloud.

Reflect:


Verses 1 and 2 serve as an introduction to the Psalm. Various translations use such terms as *extol*, *exalt*, *bless*, and *praise*. Look up the definition of each of those words in a dictionary.

What does it mean for you to extol, exalt, and praise God as King?

What does it mean for you to extol, exalt, and praise the *name* of God?

Tuesday, March 8, 2016

Read: After its introduction, Psalm 145 is divided into four major themes. Each theme is introduced with a statement that exalts/ praises/extols the name of God. The name of God occurs every time we see the word *LORD* written in all capital letters. God's name is YHWH (I Was, I Am, I Will Be). Write out the following introductory verses, BUT replace "the *LORD*" with YHWH:

Wednesday, March 9, 2016

Read: Read Psalm 145: 3-7 in more than one translation, if possible.

Reflect:

Read 145:4. Write down ways the generation of people who came before you commended the works of God and His mighty acts to you.

How are you commending the works of God and His mighty acts to the generation of people who came after you?

Psalm 145:5-7 mentions several ways to identify God's greatness. Explore these verses, and make a list of those ways.

Write out verse 7, but replace the word *they* with the word *I*. Pause and offer this verse as a prayer and pledge from you to YHWH.

Thursday, March 10, 2016

Read: Read Psalm 145:8-13a in more than one translation.

Reflect:

Reflect upon verses 8 and 9. What does mercy mean to you? Since God is "slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love," what will it take for you to receive this same kind of mercy in your life?

Reflect upon verses 10-12. These verses show some of the ways God's people can praise Him (e.g. "speak of the glory of [God's] kingdom"). Make a list of ways to praise God.

Reflect upon verse 13a. Create a prayer thanking God for what this verse reveals to you.

Friday, March 11, 2016

Read: Read Psalm 145:13b-16 in more than one translation, if possible.

Reflect:

These verses are likely speaking of more than physical needs and desires. They may also be speaking to spiritual needs and desires. Write in your own words what these verses say to you.

Saturday, March 12, 2016

Read: Read Psalm 145:17-21 in more than one translation.
Reflect: Make a list of the attributes of God you see revealed in these five verses.
Now read the entire Psalm aloud from verse 1-21.
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
Write a prayer that expresses any conviction, insights, and/or inspiration you have gained from Psalm 145 this week:

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

During your gathering and/or meal time, share with each other the answers to the phrase "I will praise God because ______." Include all ages before breaking into groups of adults and children.

Read Psalm 145 together. As you read, picture yourself as one of the divine King's subjects. What's good about living in His Kingdom? Why does God deserve praise?

What methods were used to spread the works of God to others (verses 4-7)?

Read verse four. Share some of the ways the generation of people who came before you commended the works of God and His mighty acts to you.

How are you commending the works of God to the generation of people come after you?

How does God treat his subjects (verse 9)? And the subjects treat God (verse 10)? How does this either encourage or challenge you?

Read verses 17-21 in more than one translation, making a list of the attributes of God you see revealed in these five verses.

As you close in prayer, use this list of attributes to praise your God, your King.

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
