#### **Shared Engagement and Preparation**

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

#### **Deep Engagement and Doable Application**

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

#### **Consistency Over Time**

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

## Monday, November 14, 2016

Read: Joshua 1:1-9 and Joshua 3:1-13.

#### Reflect:

In Joshua 1:1-9, record the basic instructions THE LORD gave to Joshua.

From Joshua 3:1-13, list the basic instructions Joshua and the officers gave to the people.

The passages you have just read offer insight into the spiritual preparation Joshua, the officers, and the people had to make in order to do God's will. In your opinion, how did such activity truly prepare these people to know and do God's will?

What kind of spiritual activities are you involved in that prepare you to know and do God's will in your life?

## Tuesday, November 15, 2016

Read: Joshua 3:14-17.

#### Reflect:

Look over your comments from yesterday on Joshua 3:1-13. These verses were about the preparation leaders and people made in order to do God's will. Today's verses demonstrate the actions they took to actually do God's will.

What did the leaders and people actually do in response to God's will? Make a list.

What did God do?

## Wednesday, November 16, 2016

## Thursday, November 17, 2016

**Read:** Joshua 4:15-24.

#### Reflect:

Look over your reflections from yesterday. In these verses you saw the completion of God's will for the crossing of the Jordan River by the Israelites. They performed God's will, and the purpose of God's will was fully revealed.

Read Joshua 4:15-24 again. Why did the Israelites do what they did?

Read Joshua 4:24 again. What is God saying to you today through this verse?

## Friday, November 18, 2016

Read: Joshua 5:1-9.

#### Reflect:

Read Genesis 17:1-14. What was God's covenant with Abraham?

What was the reason for circumcision in light of God's covenant with Abraham and his descendents?

Now read Joshua 5:1-9 again. Why, in your opinion, was it important for circumcision to be done again, before the Israelites could take possession of the land God was giving back to them?

Read Jeremiah 31:31-34 and 32:40. This is prophecy of the "new covenant" confirmed through faith in Jesus. Now read Hebrews 8:8-13 and 10:15-25. Circumcision was an important sign of belonging to the "old covenant" for the Israelites. Baptism is the important sign of belonging to the "new covenant" for Christians. Read Matthew 28:19-20, Acts 2:38-41 and 22:15-16. Why is it important to be baptized as a Christian?

## Saturday, November 19, 2016

Read: Joshua 5:10-15.

#### Reflect:

The Israelites observed the Passover. Why do you think this was important?

The gift of manna (food from heaven) stopped the day after they observed the Passover. Why do you think this was important?

Read Joshua 5:13-15 again. What, of importance, stands out to you from these verses?

It was important for the Israelites to observe the Passover as a confirmation of their participation in the Abrahamic Covenant. We observe the Lord's Supper (developed out of the Passover observance) as a confirmation of our participation in the New Covenant. Read Luke 22:7-20. What spiritual insights do you have from this reflection?

## **Building Our Base Camp Family**

This is week three of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, <u>mixed</u>, invitation/service.

Discuss with each other some of the things God shared with you last week. How have you followed God's call in these revelations? How can your Base Camp family help?

Spend some time as a mixed group sharing some of the transformational thoughts or actions that God has revealed to you this week, How is God moving in your life?

Remember your group is made up of different ages. Listen intently to all age groups and encourage everyone to share. God often uses His people to speak to each other, sharing different perspectives and experiences.

Collect Prayer requests from one another and spend some time in prayer for each other.


