Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

Monday, November 7, 2016

Read: Joshua 2.

Reflect:

In what way did God provide for Joshua's two spies in spite of their difficulties and struggles?

Take another look at verses 8-11. What can you learn about the relationship between God's provision for you in the past and your trust that He will provide in the future?

What struggles are you facing in your life? How can you apply the lessons of Joshua 2, to trust the power of God in spite of these struggles?

Consider asking God to deliver you from your struggles as He delivered the Israelites from theirs.

Tuesday, November 8, 2016

Read: Jeremiah 29:11; Romans 8:32; John 16:32-33.

Reflect:

What does God promise in Jeremiah 29? What does Paul suggest God will give you in Romans 8?

How do these promises compare to the promise Jesus makes in John 16?

Jesus promises you will have tribulation (ESV), trouble (NIV), or difficulties (MSG). How can you reconcile this promise with the fact you worship an all-powerful God who wants what is best for you?

Pray that God will show you His will in your life, and He will make it possible for you to take heart, because Jesus has overcome the world.

Wednesday, November 9, 2016

Read: Joshua 2; James 1:2-4; 1 Peter 1:6-7.

Reflect:

Your struggles in this life might often test your faith. What do James and Peter mean when they talk about your faith, or the genuineness of your faith, being tested?

How do you think Joshua's spies may have had their faith tested while in Jericho?

What does James promise as a result of your faith being tested?

Pray God will use the struggles in your life—those you've worked through, those you may be going through now, and those you may face in the future—to make you "mature and complete, not lacking anything" (NIV).

Thursday, November 10, 2016

Read: Jeremiah 29:4-11; Genesis 50:15-21; Romans 8:26-28.

Reflect:

Throughout the Old and New Testaments, God promises good for His people. If you're going through a difficult time right now, how do these verses affect your perspective?

How does it make you feel to know the Almighty Creator of the universe has promised to prosper you, and all things work together for your good?

How can you reconcile these verses with Jesus' claim that "in the world [we] will have trouble" (John 16:33, NIV)?

Friday, November 11, 2016

Read: Jonah 4; Psalm 37:4; Jeremiah 29: 4-14.

Reflect:

The Jonah verses take place after he shared the Good News of God in Nineveh and the people repented. Why do you think Jonah was so angry? Why does Jonah accuse God of being merciful? In what ways do Jonah's desires fail to match God's desires?

Do you ever get the sense that your definition of good and God's definition of good aren't always the same? Try to think of an event, experience, or lesson during your life in which you *thought* you knew best, but God *actually* knew best.

Take another look at Jeremiah 29. It is true God promised to prosper His people, but He also said they were going to be in exile for generations. What might this teach you about the differences between your definition of what is good and God's definition?

What do you think God is promising in Psalm 37:4? What might happen to your desires if you were to truly delight yourself in the Lord?

Saturday, November 12, 2016

Read: Joshua 2.

Reflect:

Given the previous days' questions, how can you interpret God's promises that He will prosper you (Jeremiah 29:11), all things work together for your good (Romans 8:28), and Jesus has overcome the world (John 16:33)?

When you look at the entire history of God's people in the Old Testament, there is a clear pattern of God fulfilling His promises. The ancient Israelites didn't have the whole story. They had to live it day to day just as you do. How can you trust in and rely on the promises of God in spite of your current circumstances?

Pray God will reveal all the promises He's fulfilled in your life, and those fulfilled promises and answered prayers will allow you to see He has been working all things together for your good and allow you to take heart, for He has overcome the world.

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

Prepare

Encourage your Base Camp to read Joshua 2 and/or complete the week's Compass before arriving to Base Camp.

Intergenerational Element

As you share a meal, ask everyone to tell about a time when they were courageous. Pay attention to the stories of students and children.

Adult Study

Open with a minute of silent reflection on this question: How comfortable are you with your own failure(s)?

Read Joshua 2, then discuss:

- What was Rahab's profession? What was her tribal affiliation or nationality? What would the Israelite spies think of Rahab? Would they expect her to know YHWH, their God? Would she be a failure?
- Commentators clearly think it was not for sexual reasons, so why might the Israelite spies choose to lodge in Rehab's home? Would they expect Rahab to hide them?

Read Joshua 2:8-13, and discuss:

- How did Rahab come to know YHWH?
- What did this cause her to ask the spies? Why?
- Read Joshua 2:17-21, and discuss:
- What did the spies promise? How might this have shaped Rahab's faith?

Read 2:22-24:

- What impact did Rahab's words have on Israel? Discuss:
- What can we learn from Rahab?
- What verses encourage you as you overcome failure?
- What does it take to see others as faithful Rahabs rather than failed Rahabs?


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Mission and Vision
