# Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

# **Message Notes**

Sermon Passages: Luke 15:11-32.



#### **Shared Engagement and Preparation**

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

#### **Deep Engagement and Doable Application**

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

#### **Consistency Over Time**

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

#### Reflect:

Given there are several different responses to sowing — some producing growth, some producing no crops — how does this influence the sower?

How is your "sowing" influenced by how others hear and understand the message about the kingdom?

When do you sow among the birds, rocks and thorns?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Imagine preparing the ground in advance, before you sow. What would that look like in your life?

Record two things you will do this week to "prepare the soil" before sowing seed.

## Wednesday, June 8, 2016

**Read:** Review the parable of the sower; Isaiah 52:7; Romans 10:13-17; John 3:16 and Romans 10:9.

#### Reflect:

We consider sowing as a means of spreading the message of God's kingdom.

As a sower facing the challenges of sowing in many different environments, how do you <u>prepare</u>?

Who will help you sow?

Where/how do you get good seed?

How are you prepared to sow, to spread the good news? (Recall people who have sown seed in your life and things/events that have prepared you.)

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

If you had to explain John 3:16 and Romans 10:9 to someone who was receptive but knew nothing about God, Jesus, or salvation — how would you present these ideas?

## Thursday, June 9, 2016

**Read:** Matthew 13:11-17, 23; 2 Timothy 4:2-5; 1 Corinthians 1:18; and Acts 1:8.

#### Reflect:

The parable of the sower and Jesus's dialog with the disciples about certain listeners' failure to hear, displays clearly people will reject the Gospel. Jesus also talks about the message bearing 30, 60 or a 100 times what was sown. (1 bushel of wheat seed usually produced about 7 bushels of grain).

How does this influence your attitude, faith and action as a sower?

What could you say about the <u>generosity</u> or <u>trust</u> of one who sows for Christ?

Who sows: God or people?

Where have you seen 30, 60 or 100 times multiplication of "crops?"

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Trust God to bless one small step of sowing this week. You do not need to lead a city-wide crusade? Write your first step:

## Friday, June 10, 2016

Read: Matthew 13:3-23; 2 Timothy 2:15; and 2 Timothy 3:15-17.

#### Reflect:

As you sow, you need to "correctly handle the word of truth." What would it mean to "do your best" to handle this word of truth?

What steps have you taken to know God's Word?

Where would you like to improve? Who/what could help you improve?

How has the message of the Kingdom influenced you? Has it changed your desire to share (and sow) with others? How so?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Ask someone to share their "good news story," or their salvation experience. Journal about how their story influences you.

## Saturday, June 11, 2016

**Read:** Matthew 13:3-23; briefly review the other parables in Matthew 13.

#### Reflect:

The parable of the sower and other parables in Matthew 13 give repeated messages about believers and unbelievers. Is Jesus giving His disciples a warning? Encouragement? Directions?

How would you sum up the purpose for these parables?

What is the daily life application of the parable of the sower? If you are confronted by unbelief, what will you do?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Ask God to reveal opportunities to sow. Ask Him to speak to your heart and mind during worship on Sunday, and bless your discussion of the topic at Base Camp. Plan to generate ideas and applications around sowing.

## **Building Our Base Camp Family**

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

As you gather or connect around a meal, interact with all ages. Describe a time when you planted a seed and watched a plant grow. What contributed to the growth?

In your adult study, read Matthew 13:1-23 aloud. What stands out to you in this parable?

As you listen to the description of the four soils, which one best describes *your* response when you first heard the Gospel?

Why did Jesus use parables to teach the crowd (13:3, 10-15)?

Jesus gives his own interpretation of the parable of the sower (13: 18-23). According to Jesus, to what do each of the following refer: "The seed that fell along the **path...rocks...thorns...soil**?"

How would you describe the root system in your spiritual life right now?

What steps could you take to improve the soil in your spiritual life? The life of your family? Your Base Camp? Your neighborhood?

Close your time in prayer. Consider breaking into groups of men and women to share requests and pray for each other, our neighborhoods, and world.


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### Mission and Vision
