Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways—as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings—and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passage for December 19 – December 24, 2016:

Luke 2:8-14

Monday, December 19, 2016

Read: This week we will look at Luke 2:8-14. In preparation for deeper reflection on Luke 2:8-14, <u>read Luke 1:1-7</u>.

Reflect: Now read Luke 2:1-7 one more time, paying attention to the sequence of events. Close your Bible and record this sequence. For example, Caesar Augustus issued a decree, Quirinius was governor when this decree was issued, Joseph started a journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, etc.

Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem was difficult, dangerous, and no doubt filled with the anxiety of many expectations with unknown consequences. Journal what you think some of the "unknowns" and "expectations" might have been for them.

Imagine Mary and Joseph have asked you to pray for them before they begin their journey to Bethlehem. Compose your prayer for them.

Now record a prayer for yourself and your journey through this year's Christmas season.

Tuesday, December 20, 2016

Read: Luke 2:1-14.

Reflect: Now read Luke 2:8-9 in at least two other translations of the Bible

Imagine the serene beauty of the shepherds out in the fields watching their flocks by night. Make a list of some Christmas carols and key verses that depict this setting.

The shepherds were about to have an amazing experience that would bring them great joy. Think about Christmases in your past when you experienced great joy. Comment about what you remember of those Christmases, and why they brought you such joy.

Offer a prayer of thanks to God for the times He has brought joy into your life.

Wednesday, December 21, 2016

Read: Luke 2:1-14.
Reflect: Read Luke 2:10-11 in at least two translations.
The angel declared "good news of great joy." The "good news" is the announcement of the birth of "a Savior," who is "the Christ (Messiah)," and who is also "The Lord."
Why is the announcement of "a Savior" good news?
Why is it important Jesus is the Savior and the Christ (Messiah)?
Why is it important Jesus is not only the Savior, and the Christ (Messiah), but also the Lord?
Report when, where, and how you see the "Good News" of Jesus the Savior, Christ, and Lord being declared today.
Offer a prayer of thanks for Jesus: the Savior, the Christ (Messiah), and the Lord.


Thursday, December 22, 2016

Read: Luke 2:1-14.
Reflect: Read Luke 2:12-14 in at least two translations.
Reflect upon Luke 2:12. Address some of your thoughts as to why you think God chose such a humble setting for the birth of Jesus.
Read Luke 2:13-14 again. Notice the fact the Heavenly Hosts appeared with the angel, and they all praised God. Transcribe what they specified in their praise.
What does this declaration of praise mean to you? Record your thoughts.
What helps you desire to praise God?
Offer a prayer of praise to the Lord right now.

Friday, December 23, 2016

Read: Luke 2:1-14.
Reflect: Read Matthew 1:18-25. What spiritual thoughts consume you after reading these two accounts of Jesus' birth?
List ways you have shown attention to Jesus during this Christmas season:
Create a prayer of gratitude for God's gift of Jesus who is "good news of great joya Savior, the Christ (Messiah), the Lord."

Building Our Base Camp Family

As your group gathers, have each person think about a Christmas in which great joy was experienced. Journal what you remember about that Christmas, and why it brought you such great joy.

Read Luke 2:1-20 together, with special attention to verses 8-14.

Although this is a familiar story for many of us, what stood out to you?

The angel's announcement in verse 10 is the first public announcement of the good news of Jesus' birth. Of all the people the angels could have visited, why do you suppose God sent them to the shepherds? How would you have felt if you were in the shepherds' shoes (actually sandals)?

The angel declared "good news of great joy." For whom is this good news announced? Do you recall the "angel" who first told you about Jesus?

What titles were given to Jesus in verse 11? What is significant about each of them?

The "good news" is the announcement of the birth of "a Savior," who is "the Christ (Messiah)," and who is also "The Lord." How is this good news for you today? How are you choosing to share this news with others (see what the shepherds did in verse 17)?

Describe in your own words what you see in verses 13 and 14. How might you offer similar praise to God?

Close your time in prayer for each other. Include the effect the news of Christ's birth has had on you, ending in praise by saying verse 14 together as a group.

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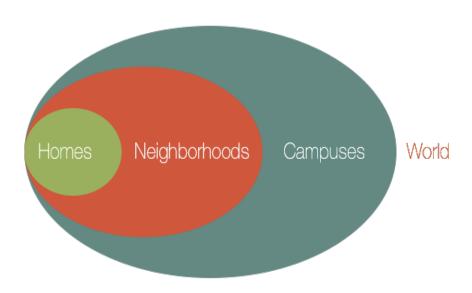
