Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

Message Notes

Sermon Passage: Psalm 67.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 2/22/16–2/27/16: Psalm 104.

Monday, February 22, 2016

Read: Psalm 104.
Reflect: 1. What impresses you about these verses?
What characteristics of God are revealed to you in verses 1 and 2?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
1. How do you bless the Lord?
2. How do you show your love to Him in worship?
3. How are you able to feel close to your Lord?

Tuesday, February 23, 2016

Read: Psalm 104 and Genesis 1:1-2:3.
Reflect: 1. What does the psalmist use from the story of creation in Genesis?
2. What evidence of God's creative handiwork do you see in your life?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
1. How is God's wisdom highlighted in Psalm 104?
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2. How is God's power highlighted in Psalm 104?

Wednesday, February 24, 2016

Read: Psalm 104, focusing on verses 27-32.

Reflect:

- 1. What is the psalmist's response to God's creation and God's sustaining control of all things in His creation?
- 2. What is your response?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Write a prayer that reflects your feelings about God's creation.

Thursday, February 25, 2016

Read: Psalm 104 and Isaiah 55:9.

Reflect:

The psalmist responds to God's holiness, wisdom, and creativity in verses 31-35. List what He does or says.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

1. Take a walk and reflect on Psalm 104. What thoughts do you now have about these verses?

2. How are God's ways higher than your ways?

Friday, February 26, 2016

Read: Psalm 104.

Reflect:

- 1. How does God care for His creation?
- 2. How has God provided for you?
- 3. How has He supported your family and friends?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

There's no shortage of clashes between those who hold to God as Creator and those who favor a science textbook/evolutionary explanation. How do you reconcile these two?

Saturday, February 27, 2016

Read: Psalm 104.
Reflect: Look back over your notes from this week.
1. What questions were answered?
2. What questions still linger for you?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
1. Find time before service tomorrow to discuss with family, Base Camp members, or others what you learned this week.
2. Bring your insights and lingering questions to Base Camp and be prepared to share them.
3. Make preparations to arrive at church on time, be in the right frame of mind to listen and delve more deeply into Psalm 104.

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week three of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, <u>mixed</u>, invitation/service. Each week will have an intergenerational element (such as the meal); then there will be a focus for the meeting that follows the pattern and is attentive to God's Word and the age mix.

Prepare: When I was in Kindergarten, one of my fondest memories was when I would go for walks with my grandfather in the afternoon. To be out on the trail and walk around the hills in back of the house was always a great time to be with him, look at creation around us, and to ask silly, five-year-old questions.

Pray about a friend, neighbor, someone God has laid on your heart, or someone you've been meaning to connect with for a while.

Invitation/Service: In our culture, we tend to meet up for meals and coffee breaks with others, but what about for a walk or hike around the area or head up to the trails and hills close by? You might be surprised by the response when you make the effort to ask. As you've been reflecting upon your reading of Psalm 104, take comfort that God is surrounding you with His creation as you converse with this person.

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
