Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

Sermon Notes

Today's Passage: 2 Corinthians 12.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass begins devotions on Monday and leads up to the Sunday which will focus on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us, not biblical information itself. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's devotion. Rather, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on and seek growth; God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 11/16/15–11/21/15: Jeremiah 17:7-8, Psalm 23:1-2, Numbers 6:24-26.

Monday, November 16, 2015

Read: Jeremiah 17:7-8, Psalm 23:1-2, Numbers 6:24-26.
Reflect: What does it mean to be blessed?
Begin to make a list today of the blessings you have both individually and as a family.
Take 5 minutes to sit quietly in God's presence and reflect on the fact you are blessed as one of His children.
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?
How does realizing you are blessed impact your attitude? Are people you encounter each day able to see you are blessed by

God?

Tuesday, November 17, 2015

Read: Matthew 5:3-12 through several times in at least two versions. Allow the truth of God's Word to penetrate your heart and mind.

Reflect:

How does a Christian's view of blessing look compared to the world's view of blessing?

How does an eternal perspective change your view of your current circumstances?

How does understanding your position with God change how you live each day?

Take time to add to your list of blessings, then pray through the list generated, thanking God for each of these blessings.

Wednesday, November 18, 2015

Read: Psalm 1:1-3; Psalm 23:1-2 and Psalm 100.

Reflect:

As Thanksgiving approaches, we as a nation have the opportunity to focus on the blessings God has provided, acknowledge these as gifts from Him.

How does your life reflect an attitude of gratefulness and thanksgiving?

Take time to think about your interactions with people this week. Would they characterize you as a person of gratefulness and thanksgiving? Why or why not?

What are practical ways you can live daily with an attitude of gratefulness and thanksgiving?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Take time to update your gratefulness list and spend time in prayer, asking God to give you the power to live a life of gratefulness and thanksgiving.

Thursday, November 19, 2015

Read: All of the Bible	passages we	have covered	I this week.
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Reflect:

Look up the definition for the word "blessed". What aspects of the definition surprise you? Why?

What is the significance of recognizing you are a blessed person because of Jesus' work on the cross?

Why is it important to express your thanks to God when you recognize you are a blessed person?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Continue to add to the list of things you are grateful for and begin to create an attitude of thanksgiving to God for everything you possess.

Friday, November 20, 2015

Read: Jeremiah 17:7-8, Psalm 23:1-2, Numbers 6:24-26.

Reflect:

The Bible is filled with prayers of thanksgiving. Take time to reflect on some you might be familiar with. Write out a special prayer of thanksgiving to God. Let the Spirit guide as you reflect on the special blessings you have received from Him.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Take time to express thanks to someone who has blessed you this past year. Write a note, give them a call, or send an email.

Saturday, November 21, 2015

Reflect: On your studies this week. What is the most significant
thing God has revealed as you spent time with Him?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

What one thing do you hope to change in your life as a result of your study?

Share this with a family member, friend or your Base Camp this week. Ask them to hold you accountable for this Godly habit.

Prepare your heart for worship with God's people tomorrow. Make a commitment to participate with fellow believers as you worship, respond and fellowship together. Make Sunday a priority to connect with others and encourage one another.

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week four of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, mixed, <u>invitation/service</u>.

Prepare:

As you gather for prayer before your meal, discuss the following:

- 1) Name blessings in your life that are not material things or possessions, e.g. your health, freedom, or peace.
- 2) Name people you know who are not receiving certain blessings; suggest ways you could bless them—socially, materially, spiritually, or emotionally.

Intergenerational Element:

Have older people pair up with younger individuals. Discuss things for which they are grateful. Sharing a blessing from childhood may be the most appropriate or significant idea. Regroup and share what your partner expressed.

Invitation/Service Focus:

You often take your blessings for granted. Remembering special blessings and realizing the blessings of "ordinary" things can be useful.

Invite everyone in the group to brainstorm an activity that might bestow blessings on others. You can commit to daily practices of blessing others—or plan a single event that aims to bless others: a mission's trip fundraiser, letter-writing to sponsored children, or befriending someone. 
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Mission and Vision
