

Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Genesis 6-9:17



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity — God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 7/11/16 – 7/16/16: Daniel 6.

Monday, July 11, 2016

Read: Daniel 6.
Reflect: Why do you think God wanted this story to be included in the Bible? What lesson do you think you should take away from it?
In what way was Daniel faithful to God?
In what way was God faithful to Daniel?
What challenges are you facing in your life that might make it difficult for you to be faithful to God? What encouragement can you take from this story?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Tuesday, July 12, 2016

Read: Hebrews 11:32-33 and Luke 17:5-10.

Reflect:

Why does the author of Hebrews include Daniel (who "shut the mouths of lions"), in this list of heroes of the faith?

In Luke 17, why do you suppose Jesus answers a question about increasing your faith with a story about doing your duty?

It seems that Daniel was *faithful* in doing his duty (Daniel 6:10), and Hebrews 11 commends him for his *faith*. What do you think is the relationship between faith and faithfulness?

What would faithfulness like Daniel's look like in your circumstances?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Wednesday, July 13, 2016

Read: Romans 5:8, 1 John 4:19, and Jeremiah 29:11.

Reflect:

Before the satraps plotted against Daniel, he prospered in part, because of his obedience to God (Daniel 6:3). Do you think he obeyed God *because* he wanted to prosper in the world?

What should motivate you to obedience toward God?

Does God's faithfulness to you depend upon your obedience?

In 5th century AD, Saint Augustine wrote, "You have made us for yourself and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." How can you practice obeying God for who He is; because He has "made us for himself," rather than for the benefits that might come from obedience?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Thursday, July 14, 2016

Read: Daniel 6 and James 1:1-4.
Reflect: According to James, why does God allow your faith to be tested?
How did Daniel react when his faith was tested (when King Darius passed the law banning prayer to God)?
Daniel went from a circumstance in which obedience to God caused him to prosper, to a circumstance in which obedience to God threatened his life. He obeyed in both cases. How can you be obedient to God despite your circumstances?
In what ways is your faith being tested? How can you take encouragement from Daniel and James? Be specific.
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Friday, July 15, 2016

Read: Romans 13:1-5, Daniel 3:8-15, 3:24-28 and Matthew 22:15-21.

Reflect:

In Romans, Paul was advised to submit to the authorities. Should Daniel have submitted to Darius' new law?

How does Matthew 22:15-21 help explain the tension between the requirement to obey your rulers and the requirement to obey God?

What do the story of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, and the story of Daniel and the lions have in common?

Both King Darius and King Nebuchadnezzar worshipped God once they had seen His power. What opportunities do you have to publicly obey God, or to demonstrate God's greatness through your obedience?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Saturday, July 16, 2016

Read: Luke 22:39-44 and Luke 9:21-23.
Reflect: In Daniel 6, Daniel was faithful to God and God was faithful to Daniel. How was Jesus faithful to His Father in Luke 22?
How was God faithful to you by sending His Son to the cross?
What opportunities do you have to "pick up your cross daily?"
In what way does daily, faithful obedience to God provide an opportunity to become more like Jesus?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week three of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, adult study, <u>mixed</u>, invitation/service.

This week, as you meet together as a group, give members of all ages the opportunity to speak and interact. Remember God has brought this group together and He wants to teach, no matter what your age may be.

As a group share about the story of Daniel and what stood out to you. (This is a great time to share how God has challenged you throughout the week in your quiet time and in the Compass)

What is the point of this story? Why do you think God included it in His Word to mankind?

In what way is your faith being tested today?

How, as a group, can we walk together in faith?


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Mission and Vision
