







The Ascent Church Elder Board is accepting nominations for new Elders.

Response Time


Each Sunday service, after the message, we have a time of response to God. We invite you to engage in worship through some tangible ways throughout our worship space.

Sermon Passages: Job 8:21, Psalm 16:6, Romans 15:13, Psalm 139:7-10, Philippians 1:27 and 4:23.



Shared Engagement and Preparation

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

Deep Engagement and Doable Application

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

Consistency Over Time

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity—God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 4/4/16–4/9/16: Mark 4:33-34, Luke 6:46-49, Luke 14:25-35.

Parables are short stories Jesus used to shape and challenge the thinking and perception of his listeners, including his disciples. He used them so frequently that this form of teaching was perceived as belonging uniquely to Jesus. His longer parables received titles—often misleading ones, so be careful. Luke 15:11-32 has been called the parable of the prodigal son, but it's actually about the father's prodigious love. Hopefully, during this series you'll be open to Jesus changing your perceptions, expectations, and ways of living out what he teaches.

Monday, April 4, 2016

Read: Mark 4:33-34 and Matthew 13:1-3.

Today you begin another spiritual journey in Scripture. This journey explores many of the parables Jesus used in his teaching. Read today's Scripture. Why do you think Jesus often used parables in his teaching?

In the NIV Study Bible, footnoted under Matthew 13:3 and Mark 4:2, 8:4, is some excellent explanations about parables. The Oxford Annotated Bible says, "Parables are stories describing situations in everyday life which, as Jesus used them, convey a spiritual meaning (Matthew 13)." Research parables as a teaching technique, then complete the following:

Reflect:

Read Matthew 13:10-16. Why do you think Jesus used parables in his teaching?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Tuesday, April 5, 2016

Read: Luke 6:46-49 in more than one translation, if possible.
Reflect: Read the parable carefully, then close your Bible and reproduce the parable in your own words.
What is the lesson of this parable?
Read James 1:22-25 and 2:18. What parallels do you see between the Luke and James passages?
What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Wednesday, April 6, 2016

Read: Luke 6:46-49.

Reflect:

Jesus asks the question "Why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do what I tell you?" Read John 13:12-17, 21:15-19, and Romans 10:8-13. What does it means to you to know Jesus as Lord?

What transforming thoughts were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Read Matthew 7:13-27, and think about what it means for Jesus to be Lord of your life.

Thursday, April 7, 2016

Read: Luke	14:25-35 in	more than o	one translation,	if possible.
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Read Luke 14:25-27 and Matthew 10:37-39 aloud. What's the primary lesson revealed in these passages?

Why do you think Jesus used the word hate in Luke 14:26-27 when he referred to what it meant to be a true disciple?

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Friday, April 8, 2016

Read:	Luke	14:25-35.
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Reflect:

Look over Luke 14:31-33. In your own words, explain the meaning of this verse.

Read Luke 14:34-35 and then Matthew 5:13-15. In your own words, explain the primary meaning of these verses and their application for your life.

What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

Saturday, April 9, 2016

Read: Matthew 13:1-3, 10-17 and Luke 14:25-35.
Reflect: Journal the spiritual insights that rise to the surface for you as you

Building Our Base Camp Family

This is week two of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: intergenerational, <u>adult study</u>, mixed, invitation/service.

Prepare:

A few days prior to meeting, remind participants to read this week's passages, bring their Compass, and Bible. Ask someone to prepare and bring leavened bread dough in the process of rising.

Intergenerational:

Prior to your meal, read Matthew 13:33. Ask the children to explain what leaven does (show them the rising bread). Ask them how the Kingdom of God might be like leaven. Sit intergenerationally and continue the conversation.

Adult Study:

Read Matthew 13:3, and discuss (10 minutes or less):

- What was the prevailing expectation of the coming of the Kingdom of God prior to Jesus?
- How does this compare to how Jesus describes it?
- Does Jesus tell this parable to refine his listener's understanding or to unsettle their understanding?

Read Luke 14:25-27 and discuss (10 minutes or less):

- Prior to Jesus, what was the prevailing expectation of being another's disciple?
- Does Jesus make this comparison to refine or unsettle his listener's understanding?
- Given your answers, do you expect to learn a little or much from the sermon series that started this week?

Read Luke 6:46-49 and consider each of these questions:

- Suppose you come to understand something significantly new in this series. What is the risk you face? How do you need to prepare your heart for this?
- What are some ways others could help you become more like the man who laid a foundation on rock?


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Mission and Vision
