# Message Notes

Sermon Passages: Luke 10:25-42.



#### **Shared Engagement and Preparation**

The Compass is a daily devotional and study guide for individuals, families, and Base Camps. The Compass has Biblical reflections for each day, beginning on Monday and leading up to Sunday, which will help us all meditate on the week's passage. In this way, the whole of the church engages in God's Word and prepares for our time of worship and preaching.

#### **Deep Engagement and Doable Application**

In order to allow for deep impact by God through His Word, The Compass centers on one passage in three ways — as individuals, with others, in our corporate gatherings — and focuses on applying what God is showing us. Life transformation happens when God's people depend upon and live out what He has revealed to us in His Word.

#### **Consistency Over Time**

With a tool such as The Compass, we can mistakenly measure personal spiritual success or failure based on whether we've completed a given day's reflection. Instead, use The Compass as a resource for individual and community growth. If you miss a few days, move on, pick it up from the next day, and seek maturity— God will honor this.

Our prayer is that God will bless you as you seek to connect intimately with Him, intentionally with His people, and influentially in His world.

The Compass Passages for 5/30/16–6/4/16: Luke 15:11-32.

# Monday, May 30, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32.

#### **Reflect:**

This is one of Jesus' most famous parables. It's the story of a father and his two sons, and it's designed to illustrate spiritual dynamics regarding the nature of God, the nature of humanity, and the nature of our relationship with God. Today, we'll focus on the younger son: the prodigal.

What were the living conditions of the younger son before he received his inheritance? What kind of person was he?

In your own words, write down what happened to the younger son after he left home (Luke 15:13-19). What character changes do you notice in him during this time of his life?

Do you know anyone who's facing an experience similar to that of the younger son when he was separated from his family? If so, what might that person be feeling?

What lessons did you learn from the younger son? What transforming thoughts and/or actions were revealed to you today, and how might you put them into practice?

# Tuesday, May 31, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32 in at least two different translations.

#### Reflect:

Continue to reflect upon the younger son. What happened that caused him to return home?

What character changes do you notice in the younger son after "he came to his senses" (15:17)?

The "change of heart" we see in the younger son is an important example of what happens when a person truly repents. What did repentance involve for the younger son?

What does repentance mean for you? What changes have you made that demonstrate the reality of genuine repentance in your life?

What lessons did you learn from the younger son?

# Wednesday, June 1, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32 in at least two different translations.

#### **Reflect:**

Today, we'll focus on the older son. What do you imagine he was like before his younger brother left home?

What can you assume was going through his mind as he thought about his younger brother during their separation?

Now read Luke 15:25-30. Explain why you think it was difficult for the older brother to accept the younger when he returned home.

Do you know anyone who might be dealing with spiritual issues similar to the older son? What advice might you offer this person?

What lessons did you learn from the older son?

# Thursday, June 2, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32.

#### **Reflect:**

Today, we'll focus on the father. In chronological order, record the emotions you saw the father experience.

What did the father do when his younger son returned?

How did the father relate to his younger son?

How did the father relate to his older son?

What lessons did you learn from the father?

# Friday, June 3, 2016

Read: Luke 15:11-32 in THE MESSAGE by Eugene H. Peterson.

#### **Reflect:**

Look over your reflections on the sons and the father. Now answer the following questions:

What did you discover about God from the father's actions?

What insights did you gain about yourself and about the people around you when you reflected on the behavior of the sons?

Communicate the primary spiritual message of this story.

# Saturday, June 4, 2016

Read: Luke 15:1-32.

### Reflect:

Record your response to the following questions:

What is the foremost lesson of the parable of the lost sheep? (Luke 15:1-7)

What is the chief lesson of the parable of the lost coin? (Luke 15:8-10)

What is the principal lesson of the parable of the lost son? (Luke 15:11-32)

Each parable concludes with a focus on the joy that God and the heavenly hosts experience when a sinner repents and the lost are found. When was the last time you had this joy? How have you contributed to making this kind of joy happen?

# **Building Our Base Camp Family**

This is week one of our suggested four-week pattern for Base Camps: <u>intergenerational</u>, adult study, mixed, invitation/service.

This parable teaches us about forgiveness.

The man had two sons. The youngest made some poor choices and the older son stayed committed to serving his father at home. The older son left home, took all his money and belongings, and squandered everything. He sinned and made many mistakes. He was ashamed and felt unworthy to be called his father's son. The main idea is you can always come home to the Father. He knows you will sin, because you live in a fallen world. He calls you to repent and return to him. He loves you unconditionally.

God forgives you, so why do you hold on to anger and unforgiveness? God welcomes you home with open arms, and he celebrates your return, just as the father did for his younger son.

Pass out paper to each person in your Base Camp. Have each person record the name of someone in their life who needs forgiveness. Everyone should hang this paper in their homes where it will be seen often, so they will be reminded of their need to forgive. During the week, everyone should attempt to release these burdens, forgiving as God has forgiven them. If it's appropriate, or if people feel comfortable, they can share with others in Base Camp.


